RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

TIA, WAM

Appropriates funds for the department of transportation to plant trees

along the center median of Kahekili Highway.

SB 946

RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE LICENSE REVOCATION.

TIA, JDL

Permits driver whose license has been administratively revoked for life to seek reinstatement of the license after 10 years have passed since the

lifetime revocation. Requires driver to have had no arrests or convictions for driving while license revoked and be free from

dependency or abuse of alcohol and drugs.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
