HB 496

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, FIN

Increases the State Highway Fund's allotment and expenditure for bikeways to five per cent of federally eligible moneys and requires that five per cent of the Fund's moneys expended for the construction, maintenance, and repair of county roads be used to improve county walkways to enhance pedestrian use and access.

HB 931

RELATING TO MOPEDS.

TRN, JUD

Exempts certain three wheeled mopeds from passenger and seating

restrictions on the operation of mopeds.

HB 1444

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE ALARM SYSTEMS.

TRN, JUD

Prohibits motor vehicle alarm manufacturers from causing to be sold in the State alarm systems that cannot electronically notify the motor vehicle owner that the alarm is being activated. Prohibits motor vehicle owners from operating a vehicle that lacks electronic notification capability. Subjects violators to traffic code penalties.

HB 1445

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE ALARM SYSTEMS.

TRN, JUD

Prohibits the use of audible motor vehicle alarms in the State.

Prohibits motor vehicle owners from operating a motor vehicle with an alarm system that lacks electronic capability. Subjects violators to

traffic code penalties.

HB 1446

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

TRN, JUD

Permits motor vehicle backup warning beepers to be disabled if the vehicle is equipped with a rear view camera system, or a watchperson

is on duty.

НВ 332	RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS. Allows audible reverse warning system to be manually turned off between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., provided the vehicle is guided by a person other than the driver of the vehicle	TRN, JUD
HB 443	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE NOISE. Amends motor vehicle muffler noise law to provide a schedule of increased fines for the second, third, and subsequent violations. Decreases the maximum penalty for the first violation from \$250 to \$100.	TRN, JUD
HB 156	RELATING TO THE USE OF MOBILE PHONES WHILE DRIVING. Prohibits the use of a mobile telephone while driving unless equipped with a hands-free accessory and being used in the hands-free mode. Exempts mobile radios.	TRN, JUD
НВ 1205	RELATING TO TRAFFIC ABSTRACTS. Clarifies the content requirements for traffic abstracts.	TRN, JUD
НВ 1215	RELATING TO TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS. Expands scope of traffic infractions law to include infractions committed by minors. Permits concurrent trials and clarifies requirements. Clarifies citation form requirements. Authorizes use of electronic citations.	TRN, JUD
НВ 1254	RELATING TO CHAPTER 291E, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES. Creates a felony charge for those who drive after a court revoked their license for DUI convictions and a new criminal offense for those who drive after a court suspended their license for DUI convictions.	TRN, JUD
НВ 1686	RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSE. Repeals the option to impose a 30-day prison term as a penalty for driving without a license for drivers whose license to operate mopeds, motor scooters, motorcycles, passenger cars, and trucks or vans having a gross vehicle weight rating of 15,000 pounds or less expired within the 90 days preceding the violation.	TRN, JUD
HB 1426	RELATING TO DEFERRED PLEAS. Conforms deferred acceptance of guilty law to the federal commercial driver licensing law for consistency.	TRN, JUD
HB 1421	RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROPERTY DAMAGE. Establishes a fine and requires community service and the revocation of driver's license for a one-year period for graffiti violation on public or private property.	TRN, JUD
HB 1559	RELATING TO HIGHWAYS. Makes flexible highway design applicable to Koolau Loa Coastal Highway from Kaaawa to Waimea on Oahu, and to Lower Puna to Kapoho Coastal Road on the island of Hawaii.	TRN, FIN

HB 779 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TRN, FIN Appropriates funds for the reconfiguration of the portion of the H-1 Freeway over the Kunia interchange in the eastbound direction, to provide for a third lane of travel. HB 720 RELATING TO TOLL ROADS. TRN, FIN Authorizes director of transportation to impose toll charges on existing highways or construct new toll roads. Provides for agreement with private entities to construct, operate, and maintain toll roads. Requires prior feasibility study. HB 1951 RELATING TO CARGO SERVICE. TRN, EDB Requires the Department of Transportation and Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, to study and recommend solutions to tentative plans by Young Brothers Ltd. to discontinue its less-than-container-load cargo service after January 1, 2010. HB 155 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. TRN, FIN Requires the Department of Transportation, to the extend practicable, to comply with county outdoor lighting ordinances that are more stringent than other laws and regulations at airports, harbors, and highways. HB 1429 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. TRN, JUD Increases fines imposed on users and tenants who violate chapter 266, the department's administrative rules, or any lawful command of any harbor master, agent, or district manager. Allows for a full recovery of fines imposed on the DOT for violations of federal and state air and water pollution laws committed by harbor users and tenants. HB 481 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRN, FIN TRANSPORTATION TO INSTALL NAVIGATION LIGHTS ON THE BRIDGE OVER KALANIANAOLE HIGHWAY AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE HAWAII KAI MARINA ON OAHU. in FY 2007-2008 to department of transportation to Appropriates \$ install navigation lights on the bridge over Kalanianaole highway at the
