(HSCR898)

Creates an affordable housing inventory advisory commission to identify, maintain, and report to the legislature on estimates of the existing and potential supply of all categories of affordable housing and the existing and potential demand for affordable housing in the State. Requires the commission to make recommendations to relevant state or county agencies to encourage affordable housing opportunities

in the State. (HB906 HD1)



HB 1001 HD2 (HSCR1186) RELATING TO HOUSING.

CPH/IGM, WAM

Provides an expedited process for county review and decision on planning, zoning, and construction exemptions sought by a developer of an affordable rental project. Provides, if the county fails or refuses to take action on the proposed project, for the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to review and make a decision on the proposed project. Makes the provisions applicable only to a county with at least 500,000 residents for a four-year period. Appropriates

funds. (HB1001 HD2)

HB 667 HD1 RELATING TO KUKUI GARDENS RENTAL HOUSING

HD1 COMPLEX. (HSCR1058) Appropriates

Appropriates funds to purchase a property interest or finance condemnation proceedings to acquire the Kukui Gardens rental housing complex. Increases the ceiling on state revenue bonds issued by the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to assist the tenants of Kukui Gardens rental housing complex to acquire the
