HB 487 HD1 (HSCR1053)	RELATING TO HOUSING PROGRAMS. Makes technical amendments to a variety of state laws to implement the recommendations of the Legislative Reference Bureau report to the Legislature pursuant to Section 14 of Act 180, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006 concerning references that should be substituted in place of references to the Housing and Community Development Corporation of Hawaii that was repealed by Act 180. (HB487 HD1)	СРН
HB 1264 (HSCR776)	RELATING TO HOUSING. Exempts certain lessees from the ten-year buyback and shared appreciation equity restrictions.	СРН
HB 1337 HD1 (HSCR814)	RELATING TO THE DEATH CARE INDUSTRY. Provides additional protections for consumers of cemetery or funeral services. (HB1337 HD1)	СРН
HB 1339 HD1 (HSCR964)	RELATING TO CONTRACTOR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY OR DISASTER. Ensures an adequate supply of licensed contractors available to perform necessary repairs and reconstruction work during a state of emergency or disaster. (HB1339 HD1)	СРН
HB 483 HD1 (HSCR1130)	RELATING TO CHECK CASHING. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to regulate the check cashing industry through licensing requirements. (HB483 HD1)	СРН
HB 776 (HSCR388)	RELATING TO TICKET SALES. Makes it an unfair or deceptive act or practice in trade or commerce for a ticket broker to fail to disclose that a fee will be charged when the consumer uses a credit card to buy tickets.	СРН
HB 1612 (HSCR787)	RELATING TO CONSUMER CREDIT REPORTING AGENCIES. Allows any consumer to place a security freeze on the consumer's credit report.	СРН



HB 1833 HD1 (HSCR1141)

RELATING TO UNFAIR BUSINESS PRACTICES.

Prohibits the practice of mandating the use of certain surety producers or surety insurers by applicants when a bid, payment, or performance bond is required to ensure the performance of any real property construction contract. (HB1833 HD1)
