SB 1918

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CHILDREN'S HEALTH CARE PROGRAM.

HSP/HTH, WAM

Creates a three-year pilot program in which the department of human services pays half of the premiums for the health care provided by a mutual benefit society to uninsured children thirty-one days to eighteen years old who are ineligible for other state or federal health care

coverage. Appropriates funds. Sunsets June 30, 2010.

SB 1740

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

HSP/HTH, WAM

Appropriates funds to the preschool developmental screening program, the family health services division, and the injury prevention and control section to maintain existing staff and hiring additional staff

members.

SB 1798

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

HTH/HSP, CPH

Adds advanced practice registered nurses to the persons who must prescribe the psychotropic medication that the department of human services may not restrict or limit coverage for under section 346-59.9,

HRS. Makes technical amendments.
