RELATING TO PROPERTY LEFT IN A DANGEROUS

IGM

CONDITION.

Establishes civil penalties for property owners who fail to make reasonable efforts to repair properties left in a dangerous condition. Authorizes counties to place a lien on the property for costs incurred.

SB 755

RELATING TO COUNTY ETHICS COMMISSIONS.

IGM

Provides standards for the selection of county ethics commission

members to ensure their impartiality and independence.

SB 1818

RELATING TO COUNTY CONCESSIONS.

IGM

Provides and exemption to nonprofit corporations from the fifteen year

limit on the grant of county concessions or concession space.
