RELATING TO PUBLIC WORK PROJECTS. JDL HB 853 Clarifies that a single violation refers to each separate project where HD2the department of labor and industrial relations finds a contractor has (HSCR925) failed to comply with chapter 104. (HB853 HD2) RELATING TO ARSON. JDL HB 1158 (HSCR773) Adds recklessness to the state of mind requirement for arson in the fourth degree. Clarifies that 10,000 square feet is only the minimum amount of property damage that is required to trigger special sentencing for arson. RELATING TO JURORS AND PROSPECTIVE JURORS. JDL HB 1210 Updates and clarifies definitions. Streamlines and affords greater HD1 flexibility to the courts to determine the most efficient and effective (HSCR822) procedures for selecting, qualifying, summoning, managing, and compensating prospective jurors and jurors. Repeals obsolete provisions. (HB1210 HD1) RELATING TO FAMILY COURT. JDL, WAM HB 1211 Increases fees for court-appointed counsel and guardians ad litem in HD2 family court cases. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB1211 HD2) (HSCR1153) RELATING TO STATE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES JDL, WAM HB 1567 EXCLUDED FROM COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AND MAKING (HSCR780) APPROPRIATIONS AND OTHER ADJUSTMENTS.

Appropriates funds for salary increases and makes other cost adjustments for state officers and employees who are excluded from

collective bargaining.
