RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT.

HSP, JDL

Exempts recipients of social service payments from the scope of employment related laws; defines "recipients of social service payments" as it relates to chapters 383, 386, 392, and 393, Hawaii

Revised Statutes. (SD1)

HB 275 HD1, SD1 (SSCR1261)

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM ATHLETE AGENTS ACT.

CPH, JDL

Enacts the Uniform Athlete Agents Act to protect student-athletes and educational institutions from potential harm caused by unscrupulous athlete agents. Requires athlete agents to register with department of

commerce and consumer affairs. (SD1)

RELATING TO MINORS.

HD2 (SSCR1212)

Allows a minor who is not under the care, supervision, or control of a parent, custodian, or legal guardian to consent to the provision of primary medical care and services. (HD2)

HB 964 HD1, SD1 (SSCR1246)

RELATING TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE.

HTH, JDL

Requires that substance abuse testing be conducted according to the manufacturer's rather than the federal government's package insert. Amends definition of "substance abuse on-site screening test" to include tests used for forensic testing as a workplace testing device. (SD1)

HB 1260 HD1, SD1 (SSCR1247)	RELATING TO SENTENCING. Restores the court's authority to order a mental or medical examination of a defendant before sentencing. Effective on approval. (SD1)	HTH, JDL
HB 1306 HD2, SD1 (SSCR1223)	RELATING TO ENHANCED PENALTIES FOR SECURITIES VIOLATIONS COMMITTED AGAINST ELDERS. Adds enhanced civil and administrative penalties for securities violations committed against elders. Effective July 1, 2007. (SD1)	CPH, JDL
HB 1336 (SSCR1225)	RELATING TO SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS BY MORTGAGE BROKERS AND SOLICITORS COMMITTED AGAINST ELDERS. Provides additional sanctions for violations by mortgage brokers and solicitors committed against elders.	CPH, JDL
HB 1499 HD2, SD1 (SSCR1187)	RELATING TO OCEAN RESOURCES. Authorizes administrative inspections of bags and containers used to carry aquatic life, or vehicles or conveyances to transport aquatic life; repeals the probable cause requirement; directs the department of land and natural resources to create an administrative search scheme. (SD1)	WAH, JDL
