SB 1338 RELATING TO TORT ACTIONS. TIA, JDL Allows the finder of fact in a civil action to consider the plaintiff's failure to use a seat belt or helmet as evidence of comparative negligence. SB 523 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TIA SD1 Requires the department of transportation to include biofuel storage (SSCR18) and transmission structures in all harbor improvement master plans. (SD1) SB 1047 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA Permits drivers who are at least eighteen years of age to drive commercially. SB 1049 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA Permits drivers who are at least 18 years of age to receive a commercial driver's license. SB 1287 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA Clarifies the period of time for safety inspection of motor carrier vehicles. SB 1509 RELATING TO HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE (HOV) LANES. TIA Allows the Director of Transportation and highway engineers to use evaluation of traffic demand and traffic volumes to establish occupancy requirements for high occupancy vehicle lanes. SB 1577 RELATING TO VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTION. TIA Creates an exception from obtaining a certificate of inspection for light passenger vehicles.



TIA ONLY

SB 1684

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES AND MOTORCYCLES.
Includes the inspection of the exhaust system in the regular inspection for motor vehicles and motorcycles.

SB 1709

RELATING TO MOPEDS.
Exempts certain three wheeled mopeds from passenger and seating restrictions on the operation of mopeds.

SB 1827

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.
Repeals requirement for periodic safety checks.

TIA/HTH

SB 1683 RELATING TO AIRCRAFT NOISE.

TIA/HTH, WAM

Requires the department of transportation to monitor noise levels from airport operations, establish an aircraft noise abatement master plan, and maintain a 24-hour noise complaint hot line and website.

Establishes advisory committee.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
