SB 1034	RELATING TO TAXATION. Exempts from general excise and use taxes the fuel sold from a foreign-trade zone for intrastate air transportation by common carriers.	TIA, EDT, WAM
SB 1514	RELATING TO TRANSFERS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND. Transfers \$36.4 million from the general fund to the State Highway Fund in each of the FY 2007-2008 and 2008-2009.	TIA, WAM
SB 1677	RELATING TO TRAFFIC CONTROL. Appropriates funds for the design of a Maui traffic control center.	TIA, WAM

SB 776 RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION.

Makes amendments to clarify the fire protection responsibilities of the

State as it relates to state-owned airport facilities.

SB 830 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA/IGM, WAM

Establishes the photo red light imaging systems program. Authorizes

counties to administer the program.

SB 1041 RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF JURISDICTION OVER TIA/IGM, WAM

HIGHWAYS TO THE COUNTIES.

Creates a county highways task force to oversee transfer to counties. Transfers all state highways functions and funding to the counties over a five-year period. Gives each county jurisdiction over all state

highways in that county.

SB 1042 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TIA/IGM, WAM

Requires the department of transportation, to the extent practicable, to comply with county outdoor lighting ordinances at airports, harbors,

and highways.

SB 1048 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TIA/IGM, WAM

Requires the State, counties, and contractors performing work on a public highway to post signs warning motorists of steel plates placed in

the roadway.

SB 1046 RELATING TO FEES FOR WINDSHIELD PLACARDS FOR IGM/TIA, WAM

PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

Requires the counties to deposit all fees for temporary and replacement

disabled parking placards into the general fund.
