HB 575 HD1 (HSCR1098)	RELATING TO EMERGENCIES.  Allows the Board of the Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) to request the Governor to declare that a tourism emergency exists under certain conditions. Authorizes HTA to implement measures to respond to an emergency upon declaration by the governor of a tourism emergency. Establishes the Hawaii Tourism Emergency Trust Fund (HB575 HD1).	TSG/IGM, WAM
HB 1018 HD2 (HSCR1089)	RELATING TO LIQUOR. Establishes a condominium hotel class of liquor license. (HB1018 HD2)	TSG/IGM, CPH
HB 1287 (HSCR764)	RELATING TO UNCLAIMED PROPERTY. Eliminates the permanent escheatment of unclaimed property to the State.	TSG, WAM
HB 1767 HD1 (HSCR1128)	RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. Authorizes best value procurement by permitting governmental agencies to award design-build contracts. (HB1767 HD1)	TSG, WAM
HB 1659 HD2 (HSCR1091)	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.  Provides that any moneys received for the benefit of a government body pursuant to a solicitation of funds by the government body to cover the costs and expenses of state-sponsored trips and other state-sponsored endeavors to generate business opportunities and goodwill for the State shall be deposited into the general fund and disbursed pursuant to legislative appropriation. HB 1352 HD1	ESTABLISHING A COMMISSION TO PLAN FOR THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF HAWAII STATEHOOD.	TSG, WAM
