A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 26H-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$26H-4 Repeal dates for newly enacted professional and
- 4 vocational regulatory programs. [(a)] Any professional or
- 5 vocational regulatory program enacted after January 1, 1994, and
- 6 listed in this section shall be repealed on December 31, 2008.
- 7 The auditor shall perform an evaluation of the program, pursuant
- 8 to section 26H-5, prior to its repeal date.
- 9 [(b) Chapter 453D (licensed mental health counselors)
- 10 shall-be repealed on December 31, 2008."]
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 431M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 14 and to read as follows:
- ""Licensed mental health counselor" means a person:

1	(1) Who engages in the practice of metal health counseling					
2	and uses the title of licensed mental health					
3	counselor;					
4	(2) Who is licensed in mental health counseling practice					
5	pursuant to chapter 453D; and					
6	(3) Whose license is in effect and not revoked or					
7	suspended."					
8	2. By amending the definition of "alcohol or drug					
9	dependence outpatient services" to read:					
10	""Alcohol or drug dependence outpatient services" means					
11	alcohol or drug dependence nonresidential treatment provided on					
12	an ambulatory basis to patients with alcohol or drug dependence					
13	problems that includes interventions prescribed and performed by					
14	qualified physicians, psychologists, licensed clinical social					
15	workers, marriage and family therapists, <u>licensed mental health</u>					
16	counselor, or advanced practice registered nurses. This					
17	definition shall not imply a broadening of the scope of or					
18	granting of prescriptive authority privileges, except as					
19	otherwise allowed pursuant to chapter 457."					
20	3. By amending the definition of "day treatment services"					
21	to read:					

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""Day treatment services" means treatment services provided
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    by a hospital, mental health outpatient facility, or nonhospital
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    facility to patients who, because of their conditions, require
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    more than periodic hourly service. Day treatment services shall
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    be prescribed by a physician, psychologist, licensed clinical
    social worker, marriage and family therapist, licensed mental
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    health counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse, and
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    carried out under the supervision of a physician, psychologist,
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    licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist,
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    licensed mental health counselor, or advanced practice
    registered nurse. Day treatment services require less than
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    twenty-four hours of care and a minimum of three hours in any
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    one day."
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         4. By amending the definition of "mental health outpatient
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    services" to read:
         ""Mental health outpatient services" means mental health
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    nonresidential treatment provided on an ambulatory basis to
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    patients with mental illness that includes interventions
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    prescribed and performed by a physician, psychologist, licensed
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    clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, licensed
    mental health counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse."
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5. By amending the definition of "partial hospitalization 1 services" to read: 2 ""Partial hospitalization services" means treatment 3 services, including in-hospital treatment services or benefits, 4 provided by a hospital or mental health outpatient facility to 5 patients who, because of their conditions, require more than 6 periodic hourly service. Partial hospitalization services shall 7 be prescribed by a physician or psychologist, and may be 8 prescribed by a licensed clinical social worker, marriage and 9 family therapist, licensed mental health counselor, or advanced 10 practice registered nurse in consultation with a physician or 11 psychologist. Partial hospitalization services require less 12 than twenty-four hours of care and a minimum of three hours in 13 14 any one day." 6. By amending the definition of "qualified" to read: 15 ""Qualified" means: 16 Having skill in the diagnosis or treatment of 17 (1)substance use disorders, based on a practitioner's 18 credentials, including but not limited to professional 19 education, clinical training, licensure, board or 20 other certification, clinical experience, letters of

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1	reference, other professional qualifications, and					
2	disciplinary action; or					
3	(2) Being a licensed physician, psychologist, licensed					
4	clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist,					
5	licensed mental health counselor, or advanced practice					
6	registered nurse, and certified pursuant to chapter					
7	321."					
8	7. By amending the definition of "treatment episode" to					
9	read:					
10	""Treatment episode" means one admission to an accredited					
11	hospital or nonhospital facility, or office of a qualified					
12	physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker,					
13	marriage and family therapist, <u>licensed mental health counselor</u> ,					
. 14	or advanced practice registered nurse for treatment of alcohol					
15	or drug dependence, or both, as stipulated in a prescribed					
16	treatment plan and that would generally produce remission in					
17	those who complete the treatment. The prescribed treatment plan					
18	may include the provision of substance abuse services in more					
19	than one location and may include in-hospital, nonhospital					
20	residential, day treatment, or alcohol or drug dependence					
21	outpatient services, or any combination thereof. An admission					

- 1 for only detoxification services shall not constitute a
- 2 treatment episode."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 431M-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) Covered benefits for alcohol dependence, drug
- 6 dependence, or mental illness insurance policies, hospital or
- 7 medical service plan contracts, and health maintenance
- 8 organization health plan contracts shall be limited to those
- 9 services certified by the insurance or health care plan
- 10 carrier's physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social
- 11 worker, marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health
- 12 counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse as medically or
- 13 psychologically necessary at the least restrictive appropriate
- 14 level of care."
- 15 SECTION 4. Section 431M-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "\$431M-4 Mental illness, alcohol and drug dependence
- 18 benefits. (a) The covered benefit under this chapter shall not
- 19 be less than thirty days of in-hospital services per year. Each
- 20 day of in-hospital services may be exchanged for two days of
- 21 nonhospital residential services, two days of partial
- 22 hospitalization services, or two days of day treatment services.

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- 1 Visits to a physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social
- 2 worker, marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health
- 3 counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse shall not be
- 4 less than thirty visits per year to hospital or nonhospital
- 5 facilities or to mental health outpatient facilities for day
- 6 treatment or partial hospitalization services. Each day of in-
- 7 hospital services may also be exchanged for two outpatient
- 8 visits under this chapter; provided that the patient's condition
- 9 is such that the outpatient services would reasonably preclude
- 10 hospitalization. The total covered benefit for outpatient
- 11 services in subsections (b) and (c) shall not be less than
- 12 twenty-four visits per year; provided that coverage of twelve of
- 13 the twenty-four outpatient visits shall apply only to the
- 14 services under subsection (c). The other covered benefits under
- 15 this chapter shall apply to any of the services in subsection
- 16 (b) or (c). In the case of alcohol and drug dependence
- 17 benefits, the insurance policy may limit the number of treatment
- 18 episodes but may not limit the number to less than two treatment
- 19 episodes per lifetime. Nothing in this section shall be
- 20 construed to limit serious mental illness benefits.
- 21 (b) Alcohol and drug dependence benefits shall be as
- 22 follows:

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1	(1)	Detoxification services as a covered benefit under					
2		this chapter shall be provided either in a hospital or					
3		in a nonhospital facility that has a written					
4		affiliation agreement with a hospital for emergency,					
5		medical, and mental health support services. The					
6		following services shall be covered under					
7		detoxification services:					
8		(A) Room and board;					
9		(B) Diagnostic x-rays;					
10		(C) Laboratory testing; and					
11		(D) Drugs, equipment use, special therapies, and					
12		supplies.					
13		Detoxification services shall be included as part of					
14		the covered in-hospital services, but shall not be					
15		included in the treatment episode limitation, as					
16		specified in subsection (a);					
17	(2)	Alcohol or drug dependence treatment through					
18		in-hospital, nonhospital residential, or day treatment					
19		substance abuse services as a covered benefit under					
20		this chapter shall be provided in a hospital or					
21		nonhospital facility. Before a person qualifies to					
22		receive benefits under this subsection, a qualified					

physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social					
worker, marriage and family therapist, <u>licensed mental</u>					
health counselor, or advanced practice registered					
nurse shall determine that the person suffers from					
alcohol or drug dependence, or both; provided that the					
substance abuse services covered under this paragraph					
shall include those services that are required for					
licensure and accreditation and shall be included as					
part of the covered in-hospital services as specified					
in subsection (a). Excluded from alcohol or drug					
dependence treatment under this subsection are					
detoxification services and educational programs to					
which drinking or drugged drivers are referred by the					
judicial system and services performed by mutual self-					
help groups;					

(3) Alcohol or drug dependence outpatient services as a covered benefit under this chapter shall be provided under an individualized treatment plan approved by a qualified physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse and shall be services reasonably

expected to produce remission of the patient's
condition. An individualized treatment plan approved
by a marriage and family therapist, <u>licensed mental</u>
health counselor, licensed clinical social worker, or
an advanced practice registered nurse for a patient
already under the care or treatment of a physician or
psychologist shall be done in consultation with the
physician or psychologist. Services covered under
this paragraph shall be included as part of the
covered outpatient services as specified in subsection
(a); and

(4) Substance abuse assessments for alcohol or drug dependence as a covered benefit under this section for a child facing disciplinary action under section 302A-1134.6 shall be provided by a qualified physician, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, advanced practice registered nurse, or certified substance abuse counselor. The certified substance abuse counselor shall be employed by a hospital or nonhospital facility providing substance abuse services. The substance abuse assessment shall

- (c) Mental illness benefits.
- Covered benefits for mental health services set forth 4 (1)5 in this subsection shall be limited to coverage for diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders. 6 7 mental health services shall be provided under an 8 individualized treatment plan approved by a physician, 9 psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, 10 marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health 11 counselor, or advanced practice registered nurse and must be reasonably expected to improve the patient's 12 13 condition. An individualized treatment plan approved 14 by a licensed clinical social worker, marriage and 15 family therapist, licensed mental health counselor, or an advanced practice registered nurse for a patient 16 17 already under the care or treatment of a physician or 18 psychologist shall be done in consultation with the 19 physician or psychologist;
 - (2) In-hospital and nonhospital residential mental health services as a covered benefit under this chapter shall be provided in a hospital or a nonhospital residential

1		facility. The services to be covered shall include
2		those services required for licensure and
3		accreditation, and shall be included as part of the
4		covered in-hospital services as specified in
5		subsection (a);
6	(3)	Mental health partial hospitalization as a covered
7		benefit under this chapter shall be provided by a
8		hospital or a mental health outpatient facility. The
9		services to be covered under this paragraph shall
10		include those services required for licensure and
11	•	accreditation and shall be included as part of the
12		covered in-hospital services as specified in
13		subsection (a); and
14	(4)	Mental health outpatient services shall be a covered
15		benefit under this chapter and shall be included as
16		part of the covered outpatient services as specified
17		in subsection (a)."

20	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
