A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that medicaid is the 2 cornerstone of health care for our most needy population. 3 Further, the legislature has previously recognized that it is in 4 the public interest to ensure that health care payments made 5 with state funds or controlled by the State are sufficient to cover the actual costs of care. However, inadequate payment and 6 7 reimbursement from medicaid have compromised access to medical care not only for the uninsured and those covered by medicaid 8 9 but also for those individuals who have private employer-based 10 health insurance.

Although our community health care centers provide
excellent primary care and outreach, they do not cover specialty
and hospital care. Patients who cannot obtain access to the
health care they need are more likely to seek care in the more
expensive emergency room setting. As documented in numerous
media reports, emergency room access to specialty care coverage
has reached crisis proportions.

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1 Hawaii's hospitals in particular have been detrimentally 2 affected by the inadequacy of medicaid reimbursements and 3 payments. Hawaii's hospitals have annually lost millions of dollars because government reimbursement is far below the cost 4 of providing medical care. Between 2003 and 2005, medicaid 5 payments to hospitals covered only seventy-three to seventy-6 7 eight per cent of total medicaid costs, creating a strain on the 8 hospitals' financial stability.

9 Currently, the administrative rules of the department of human services governing fee-for-service medicaid reimbursement 10 provide only for hospital inpatient and long-term care nursing 11 rates to be adjusted annually for inflation. Reimbursement 12 13 rates for other services have gone years without a rate 14 adjustment for inflation despite the rising cost of providing 15 these services. Additionally, hospital outpatient services rates have not been increased for many years, while hospital 16 labor and other costs have increased dramatically over the 17 18 years. Consequently, hospitals have suffered financially and have had to use prior years' reserves and other funds to make up 19 the shortfall from medicaid services. 20

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1	The	purpose of this Act is to meet rising health care costs
2	and ensure that Hawaii's residents have continued access to	
3	quality health care by:	
4	(1)	Establishing a process by which medicaid fee-for-
5		service individual provider reimbursement rates are
6		increased annually for inflation;
7	(2)	Retroactively adjusting for inflation, payments made
8		to providers of hospital outpatient services and other
9		individual providers to account for the lack of a rate
10		increase for the past five years; and
11	(3)	Appropriating funds:
12		(A) To increase the medicaid fee schedule for the
13		fiscal biennium 2007-2009;
14		(B) To adjust for inflation payments made to medicaid
15		fee-for-service hospitals during fiscal biennium
16		2005-2007; and
17		(C) For the State's portion of the federal
18		disproportionate share hospital allowance.
19	SECTION 2. Section 346-59, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
20	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
21	"(b) Rates of payment for outpatient hospital services,	
22	excluding emergency room services, and to providers of medical	
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care who are individual practitioners, including doctors of 1 2 medicine, dentists, podiatrists, psychologists, osteopaths, 3 optometrists, and other individuals providing services, shall be 4 based upon the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. The amounts paid 5 shall not exceed the maximum permitted to be paid individual [practitioners] providers or other individuals under federal law 6 7 and regulation, the medicare fee schedule for the current year, 8 the state limits as provided in the appropriation act, or the 9 provider's billed amount.

10 [The appropriation act shall indicate the percentage of the 11 medicare fee schedule for the year 2000 to be used as the basis 12 for establishing the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. For any 13 subsequent adjustments to the fee schedule, the legislature 14 shall specify the extent of the adjustment in the appropriation 15 act.] Rates under the medicaid fee schedule shall be adjusted 16 each year for inflation by multiplying the rates in effect on 17 June 30 of each year by the sum of one plus the inflation factor 18 for the prior fiscal year. The inflation factor shall be based 19 on the latest available actual, or estimated if actual is not available, national index for providers of medical care. 20 This 21 subsection shall not apply to QUEST medical plans."

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SECTION 3. The department of human services shall adjust 1 2 payments made for noninstitutional items and services provided by medicaid fee-for-service providers during fiscal biennium 3 4 2005-2007, for inflation by multiplying those payments by the 5 sum of one plus the inflation factor for the prior fiscal year, based on the latest available actual, or estimated if actual is 6 not available, national index for providers of medical care. 7 8 The department of human services shall reimburse providers for 9 the difference between actual payments and adjusted payment 10 amounts; provided that the amounts paid shall not exceed the 11 maximum permitted to be paid individual practitioners or other 12 providers under federal law and regulation, and the medicare fee schedule for the current year. 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to adjust 17 for inflation payments made to medicaid fee-for-service 18 hospitals during fiscal biennium 2005-2007.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of20 human services for the purposes of this Act.

21 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general

22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much

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thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
 2008-2009 to increase the medicaid fee schedule pursuant to
 section 346-59(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department6 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the
10 State's portion of the federal disproportionate share hospital
11 allowance.

12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the human13 services for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
