2 extension; and that is able to support communications using the  
3 Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) suite,  
4 or its subsequent extension, or other IP-compatible protocols;  
5 and that provides, uses, or makes accessible, either publicly or  
6 privately, information to users.

7 "Internet portal" means the centralized electronic  
8 information system by which public information is provided via  
9 dial-in modem or continuous link to the public through  
10 subscriptions.

11 "Portal manager" means the entity or person engaged to  
12 manage and operate the Internet portal on behalf of the State of  
13 Hawaii.

14 "Value added electronic services" means services including,  
15 but not limited to:

- 16 (1) Providing periodic, continual, and ongoing access to  
17 information maintained by a government agency without  
18 requiring separate requests for information as it is  
19 created;
- 20 (2) Compiling data or performing other research services;
- 21 (3) Permitting the electronic filing of reports, renewals,  
22 or application; or



1 (4) The ability to transact business over the Internet  
2 portal.

3 § -3. Any statute to the contrary notwithstanding,  
4 government agencies may charge for value added electronic  
5 services provided through the portal manager.

6 § -3. **Access Hawaii committee; establishment;**  
7 **membership; chairperson.** (a) There is established within the  
8 department of accounting and general services, the Access Hawaii  
9 Committee.

10 (b) The committee shall consist of not more than eleven  
11 voting ex officio members, or their designated representatives,  
12 as follows:

- 13 (1) The comptroller of the department of accounting and  
14 general services;
- 15 (2) The administrator of the information and communication  
16 services division in the department of accounting and  
17 general services;
- 18 (3) The administrator of the state procurement office;
- 19 (4) The director of the office of information practices;
- 20 (5) The directors of not more than three government  
21 agencies using or planning to use the services of the  
22 portal manager; and



1 (6) The chief information officers of the four counties.

2 (c) The comptroller of the department of accounting and  
3 general services shall serve as the chairperson of the  
4 committee.

5 § -4. **Duties of the committee.** (a) The committee  
6 shall provide oversight of the portal manager including:

7 (1) Review of the annual strategic plan and periodic  
8 reports on potential new applications and services  
9 submitted by the portal manger;

10 (2) Review and approval of all charges to portal users;

11 (3) Review and approval of service level agreements  
12 negotiated by government agencies with the portal  
13 manager;

14 (4) Review of the annual financial reports and audit of  
15 the portal manager.

16 (5) Review of annual customer satisfaction surveys  
17 conducted by the portal manger; and

18 (6) Review of performance measures of the portal submitted  
19 as part of the service management plan for portal-wide  
20 indicators and application specific indicators.

21 § -5. **Annual Report.** The committee will submit an  
22 annual report on the operations of the portal."



1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2034.
