A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RURAL PRIMARY HEALTH CARE TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a severe 1 shortage of primary care health providers in the State, which 2 threatens the health of our residents and affects healthcare 3 4 costs. This shortage has pushed the federal government to designate a number of areas in the State, particularly rural 5 areas, as medically underserved areas, health professional 6 shortage areas, or as having medically underserved populations. 8 The legislature further finds that family physicians are well-suited to rural healthcare due to the broad scope of their 9 practice, which encompasses inpatient, outpatient, and nursing 10 home settings, and addresses acute, chronic, and preventive 11 health across the life cycle. Many family physicians also 12 provide maternity care, family planning, and mental health 13 services through their practices. 14 The University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine 15 currently offers a three-year residency program in family

- medicine. The program emphasizes a system-based and 17

- 1 the family medicine residency program is to meet the needs of
- 2 rural and medically underserved areas and populations in Hawaii
- 3 in a culturally sensitive and medically appropriate manner.
- 4 Family medicine program residents not only provide healthcare,
- 5 but also provide education and outreach at schools and community
- 6 events. Presently, family medicine program residents spend two
- 7 months in a federally-funded rural healthcare training
- 8 demonstration project, initiated in Hilo in 2006, in which
- 9 residents learn how to provide healthcare to medically
- 10 underserved patients in rural areas as they rotate among private
- 11 physician offices, emergency departments, and the community,
- 12 providing outreach and education. It is anticipated that the
- 13 Hilo rural health training program will be duplicated on Kauai.
- 14 Additional training sites will be developed in conjunction with
- 15 the health master planning process underway in Maui and with the
- 16 hospital and community health center system on Kauai. As these
- 17 sites are being developed, the curriculum can be structured so
- 18 that family medicine residents have the opportunity to rotate to
- 19 neighbor island sites other than Hilo.
- The purpose of this Act is to increase access to primary
- 21 healthcare services provided by family physicians or residents
- 22 in the family medicine residency program at the University of

- 2 State by appropriating funds to:
- 3 (1) Support and expand the family medicine residency
- 4 program of the University of Hawaii John A. Burns
- 5 school of medicine's department of family medicine and
- 6 community health to provide rural primary healthcare
- 7 services; and
- 8 (2) Develop a permanent statewide rural primary healthcare
- 9 training program in the county of Hawaii to expand the
- 10 rural healthcare training available for individuals in
- 11 the family medicine residency program of the
- 12 University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine.
- 13 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1 or so much thereof
- 15 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the sum of \$1
- 16 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
- 17 to support and expand the family medicine residency program of
- 18 the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine's
- 19 department of family medicine and community health to provide
- 20 rural primary healthcare services.
- 21 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1 or so much thereof

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- 1 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the sum of \$1
- 2 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
- 3 to develop a statewide rural primary healthcare training program
- 4 to provide family physicians to rural areas and improve
- 5 healthcare access for the people of Hawaii.
- 6 SECTION 4. The sums appropriated in sections 2 and 3 of
- 7 this Act shall be expended by the University of Hawaii John A.
- 8 Burns school of medicine for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the
- 12 Hawaii Quentin Burdick Rural Health Interdisciplinary Training
- 13 Program to continue its program addressing the shortage of
- 14 health care professionals in rural communities in the State.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 16 of Hawaii school of nursing for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
