## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC LAND.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§171- Public land; illegal use. (a) It shall be
5	illegal for a hotel or a resort to limit the use of public land,
6	including a beach, to its guests.
7	(b) For purposes of this section, "use of public land"
8	means putting equipment of the hotel or resort, including
9	chairs, tables, umbrellas, and other items typically used at a
10	beach and provided by a hotel or resort, onto public land,
11	including a beach.
12	(c) It shall be permissible for a hotel or resort to use
13	<pre>public land if:</pre>
14	(1) The public is permitted on the public land used by the
15	hotel or resort and their guests; and
16	(2) Any hotel or resort equipment is removed from the
17	public land by the hotel or resort not later than

1	thirty minutes after a guest has vacated or
2	relinquished use of the equipment.
3	(d) Any hotel or resort that violates this section shall
4	be fined:
5	(1) \$250 for the first violation; and
6	(2) \$500 for each following violation;
7	provided that each violation of this section shall constitute a
8	separate offense and any action taken to impose or collect the
9	penalty provided for in this section shall be considered a civil
10	action."
11	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
