
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED STRATEGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The weed and seed strategy is a United States
2 Department of Justice initiative that is administered locally by
3 the United States Attorney's Office. Initiated in 1992, the
4 strategy currently includes more than three hundred sites in two
5 hundred twenty-six cities across the country.

6 The weed and seed strategy is a collaborative effort among
7 federal, state, and county level law enforcement agencies,
8 social service agencies, private businesses, nonprofit
9 organizations, and residents to reclaim, restore, and rebuild
10 communities. The four key elements of the weed and seed
11 strategy are:

- 12 (1) Law enforcement;
13 (2) Community policing;
14 (3) Prevention, intervention, and treatment programs; and
15 (4) Neighborhood restoration.

16 The weed and seed strategy works with local law enforcement
17 to prevent, control, and reduce violent crime, drug abuse, and
18 gang activity in targeted neighborhoods by "weeding" out the



1 criminal element in the community. Community policing involves
2 having police officers work closely with community residents to
3 develop solutions to violent and drug-related crimes. The next
4 step is to "seed" the community with human services that include
5 prevention, intervention, treatment, and neighborhood
6 revitalization.

7 The legislature finds that the weed and seed strategy has
8 been successful since its inception in the Kalihi-Palama and
9 Chinatown areas of downtown Honolulu. The legislature also
10 finds that, since the beginning of the program, crime in those
11 areas has been significantly reduced. The legislature further
12 finds that the strategy's success warrants its expansion into
13 other communities.

14 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to
15 maintain and expand the weed and seed strategy.

16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$600,000, or so much
18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
19 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
20 2008-2009, to be dispersed as grants to maintain and expand the
21 weed and seed strategy for statewide purposes.



1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2 of the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
