A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NOISE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§291-A Noise abatement area for motor vehicles and
5	mopeds; penalties. (a) For purposes of this section:
6	"Building" means any structure used for the lodging of
7	persons therein; each unit of a building consisting of two or
8	more units separately secured or occupied is a separate
9	building.
10	"Motor vehicle" means the same as defined in section 291C-
11	<u>1.</u>
12	"Moped" means the same as defined in section 291C-1.
13	(b) No person or persons shall:
14	(1) Operate or cause to operate a motor vehicle or
15	moped which emits any noises or sounds exceeding
16	ninety-five decibels from its point of origin,
17	within 500 feet from the nearest point of any

1	(2)	Drive or operace a motor venicie or moped in such	
2		manner as to make or create any noise exceeding

4	(3)	Operate or cause to operate a motor vehicle or	
5		moped without the EPA approved sticker matching

7	(4)	Operate or cause to operate a motor vehicle or	
8		moped with an exhaust system which has been	
9		modified to make more noise or sound than the	
10		vehicle made when manufactured.

13	for the first conviction, \$200 for the second, and \$500 for the

16	(d) If a	law enforcement officer has probable cause to	
17	believe that any motor vehicle or moped has been used in		
18	violation of this section, the law enforcement officer may seize		
19	and impound the vehicle for not longer than fourteen days. The		
20	owner of a veh	icle subject to impoundment is liable for all fees	
21	and costs associated with such impoundment. The citation shall

1 to comply with subsection (b), above, before operating the 2 vehicle on public streets and highways." 3 SECTION 2. Section 291-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§291-24 Motorcycles and mopeds, noisy mufflers; penalty. 6 (a) Every motorcycle and moped moving under its own power on a 7 public highway shall at all times be equipped with a muffler in 8 constant operation to prevent any excessive or unusual noise and 9 no such muffler or exhaust system shall be equipped with a 10 cutout, bypass, or similar device. No person shall modify the 11 exhaust system of a motorcycle or a moped in a manner which will 12 amplify or increase the noise emitted by the motor of such 13 motorcycle or moped above that emitted by the muffler originally 14 installed on the motorcycle or moped except a motorcycle or **15** moped that: 16 (1) Has three wheels; 17 (2) Is powered by an electric motor; 18 Has a full body enclosed cab; and (3)

Has a seat belt assembly or a child restraint system
