
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-136, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) Except as provided in this subsection and in
4 subsection (b), any person who violates section 286-102, 286-
5 122, 286-130, 286-131, 286-132, 286-133, or 286-134 shall be
6 fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than thirty
7 days, or both~~[-]~~; provided that any person who violates section
8 286-102 within ninety days after expiration of an otherwise
9 valid license to operate the category of vehicles specified in
10 section 286-102(b)(1) through (3) shall be fined not more than
11 \$1,000. Any person who violates any other section in this part
12 shall be fined not more than \$1,000."

13 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
15 begun, before its effective date.

16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Expired Driver's License; Penalty

Description:

Repeals the option to impose a 30-day prison term as a penalty for driving without a license for drivers whose license to operate mopeds, motor scooters, motorcycles, passenger cars, and trucks or vans having a gross vehicle weight rating of 15,000 pounds or less expired within the 90 days preceding the violation.
