BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 78-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(c) All persons seeking employment with the government of
4	the State or in the service of any county shall be citizens,
5	nationals, or permanent resident aliens of the United States, or
6	eligible under federal law for unrestricted employment in the
7	United States, and shall become residents of the State [at the
8	time of] within thirty days after beginning their [application
9	for] employment and as a condition of eligibility for continued
10	employment.
11	"Resident" means a person who is physically present in the
12	State at the time the person claims to have established the
13	person's domicile in the State and shows the person's intent is
14	to make Hawaii the person's [permanent] primary residence. [In
15	determining this intent, the following factors shall be
16	considered:
17	(1) Maintenance of a domicile or permanent place of

1 (2) Absence of residency in another state; and 2 (3) Former residency in the State. This subsection's requirement for state residency shall not 3 apply to applicants for police officer positions; provided that 4 upon employment, the police officer shall establish residency as 5 a condition of continued employment as a police officer.] " 6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007. 9
