A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. House Concurrent Resolution No. 261, H.D. 1 (2006) requested the department of health, with the assistance 2 3 of the department of land and natural resources and the 4 department of facilities maintenance of the city and county of 5 Honolulu, to report to the legislature on the relationship 6 between the various Kailua waterways, including the Kaelepulu 7 pond, and the water quality and natural resources of Kailua 8 beach and Kailua bay. This system consists of interconnected 9 brackish estuarine waters, including Kawainui stream, Hamakua 10 marsh, Kaelepulu canal, Kaelepulu pond, and Kaelepulu wetlands. 11 In the 1960s, the United States Army Corps of Engineers 12 directed the natural flow to the Kawainui stream to be blocked 13 by the construction of the flood control levee to reduce the 14 threat of flooding to Kailua town. The city and county of 15 Honolulu manages the Kawainui stream and Kaelepulu canal for 16 drainage and flood control. The Hamakua wetlands are managed 17 for endangered Hawaiian waterfowl habitat by the department of 18 land and natural resources. The Kaelepulu pond and Kaelepulu HB1898 HD1 HMS 2008-2520

- 1 wetland are private property, recognized historically as a
- 2 Hawaiian fish pond and a habitat for at least three endangered
- 3 native Hawaiian waterfowl. While it is private land, both the
- 4 State and the city and county of Honolulu dump runoff into
- 5 Kaelepulu pond, as well as other waterways including Kailua
- 6 beach, Kailua bay, Hamakua marsh, and Kawainui marsh.
- 7 The Kailua waterways are listed on the State's Clean Water
- 8 Act 303(d) list of impaired waters not meeting water quality
- 9 standards for nutrients, turbidity, and bacteria load. As a
- 10 result, the Kailua waterways are presently being studied by the
- 11 department of health. Since the time of the removal of the
- 12 natural water flow from Kawainui marsh, the large majority of
- 13 the water entering the Kailua waterways does so through storm
- 14 drains under main separate storm sewer system four. Water flows
- 15 from the Kailua waterways across the sand berm at Kailua beach
- 16 and adversely impacts the quality of the near shore waters. The
- 17 near shore waters are predominantly used for resident and
- 18 tourist recreation.
- 19 The department of health's 2008 report to the legislature
- 20 lists eleven reasonable approaches that may improve the water
- 21 quality and natural resources of the estuary system and its
- 22 residual impact on the beaches and waters in Kailua bay.

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1	The	purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to address
2	water qua	lity and other issues facing Kailua waterways as
3	follows:	
4	(1)	For the department of land and natural resources to
5		implement three of the eleven aforementioned
6		approaches; and
7	(2)	For the department of transportation to plan, design,
8		and construct measures to address water quality,
9		siltation, and other waterway problems described in
10		this Act.
11	SECT	ION 2. The department of land and natural resources
12	shall:	
13	(1)	Conduct an engineering study and an environmental
14		assessment for the preliminary design and
15		specification of measures to restore adequate water
16		flow from Kawainui marsh to Kawainui stream using
17		siphons, tunnels, pumps, or other appropriate
18		measures;
19	(2)	Conduct a study to maximize the efficiency of the
20		monthly stream mouth opening procedures, as well as to
21		improve procedures to respond to threats of flooding
22		due to a blocked canal mouth. This study shall track

1		the effluent plume from the stream mouth and elucidate	
2		the fate of state standard water quality parameters,	
3		such as turbidity, nutrients, and bacteria, within	
4		Kailua bay recreational waters; and	
5	(3)	Design and implement measures to reduce the amount of	
6		polluted runoff delivered to Kaelepulu pond by	
7		redesigning and restoring the function of the Keopu	
8		flood basin, which receives waters from main separate	
9		storm sewer system four, and report to the legislature	
10		on those measures.	
11	All	studies and report directed by this section shall be	
12	transmitted to the legislature no later than twenty days prior		
13	to the convening of the regular session of 2009.		
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for		
17	the department of land and natural resources for the purposes		
18	described in section 2 of this Act.		
19	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
20	land and	natural resources for the purposes of this Act.	
21	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the state highway	
22	fund the	sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be	

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- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the department of
- 2 transportation to plan, design, and construct measures to
- 3 address water quality, siltation, and other waterway problems
- 4 mentioned in this Act; provided that the department of
- 5 transportation shall:
- 6 (1) Work in consultation with the department of health,
 7 the department of land and natural resources, and the
 8 city and county of Honolulu; and
- 9 (2) Request that the city and county of Honolulu match any
 10 funds expended for these purposes considering the city
 11 and county of Honolulu contributes to the road run-off
 12 into the Kailua waterways.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Kailua Waterways; Studies; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to conduct, and appropriates funds for, various studies and measures relating to improvements to the Kailua waterways system. Appropriates funds for the Department of Transportation to plan, design, and construct measures to address water quality, siltation, and other waterway problems in Kailua. (HB1898 HD1)
