A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by					
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read					
3	as follows:

6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:					
7	"Department" means the department of health.					
8	"Director" means the director of health.					
9	"Health enterprise zone" means an area designated by the					
10	director as underserved by primary health care providers.					
11	"Loan program" means the health enterprise zone loan					
12	program.					
13	"Primary health care provider" means a:					
14	(1) Physician licensed under chapter 453 or an advanced					
15	practice registered nurse licensed under chapter 457					
16	providing medical primary care; or					
17	(2) Dentist licensed under chapter 448 providing dental					
18	primary care,					

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1 as determined by the director. 2 "Qualified practice" means a practice at which fifty per 3 cent or more of the total amount received for services at that 4 practice for the taxable year are qualified receipts and fifty 5 per cent or more of the patients whose services are compensated 6 by qualified receipts reside in a health enterprise zone. 7 "Qualified primary health care provider" means a primary 8 health care provider with a practice located in a health 9 enterprise zone or a qualified practice that is located within 10 five miles of a health enterprise zone. 11 "Qualified receipts" means amounts received for services 12 from the Medicaid program. 13 -2 Powers, and duties of the director. The director 14 shall: 15 (1)Establish criteria for determining what areas qualify 16 as health enterprise zones; 17 (2) Administer this chapter in such a manner that each 18 area to be designated as a health enterprise zone will 19 most benefit the area and the state; 20 Conduct a continuing evaluation of health enterprise (3)

zones;

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1	(4)	Prescribe the qualifications for eligibility of
2		applicants for loans under the loan program;
3	(5)	Establish preferences and priorities in determining
4		eligibility for loans under the loan program;
5	(6)	Establish the conditions, consistent with the purposes
6		of this chapter, for the granting or for the
7		continuance of a grant of a loan under the loan
8		program;
9	(7)	Provide for inspection, at reasonable hours, of the
10		facilities, books, and records of a health care
11		provider which has applied for or has been granted a
12		loan;
13	(8)	Monitor the implementation and operation of this
14		chapter;
15	(9)	Submit annual reports evaluating the effectiveness of
16		the health enterprise zones law, and any
17		recommendations and draft legislation to the governor
18		and the legislature;
19	(10)	Adopt, administer, and enforce rules to implement this
20		chapter; and
21	(11)	Perform all other functions necessary to effectuate
22		the purposes of this chapter.

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1	§ -3 Health enterprise zone loan program. (a) There
2	is created a health enterprise zone loan program which shall be
3	administered by the director.
4	(b) In consultation with the director of health, the
5	director of the department of business, economic development,
6	and tourism shall establish and administer a program to make low
7	interest loans available to primary care providers to:
8	(1) Construct and renovate medical and dental offices or
9	health clinics located in a health enterprise zone or
10	within five miles of a health enterprise zone; and
11	(2) Purchase medical equipment for use by primary care
12	providers at practices located in health enterprise
13	zones or at qualified practices that are located
14	within five miles of a health enterprise zone.
15	§ -4 Primary health care provider tax deduction.
16	Qualified primary health care providers shall receive a
17	deduction from gross income in a taxable year equal to that
18	portion of the taxpayer's net income deriving from the
19	taxpayer's practice for the taxable year that the qualified
20	receipts of that practice for the taxable year bear to the total
21	amount received for services at that practice for the taxable
22	year, as provided in section 235

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1 Ş -5 Government assistance; prohibition. Tax 2 incentives under this chapter shall not duplicate existing state 3 tax incentives for qualified primary health care providers. 4 -6 Health enterprise zone loan program revolving 5 fund. There is established the health enterprise zone loan 6 program revolving fund into which shall be deposited: 7 (1)Legislative appropriations; 8 (2) Interest earned on any moneys in or investments of 9 moneys from the fund; 10 (3) All moneys received as repayment of loans and interest 11 payments under the loan program; and 12 (4)All other moneys distributed or transferred to the 13 fund from any source. 14 The department may make loans from the fund in accordance with 15 this chapter, and use a portion of the moneys contained in the 16 fund to administer the loan program. 17 -7 Rules. Rules implementing this chapter shall be adopted by the department pursuant to chapter 91, and where 18 19 appropriate, in consultation with the department of taxation." 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

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and to read as follows:

1	"§235- Health enterprise zone receipts excluded from
2	adjusted gross income, and taxable income. (a) In addition to
3	the exclusions in section 235-7, there shall be excluded from
4	gross income, adjusted gross income, and taxable income,
5	qualified receipts derived from a qualified primary health care
6	provider's qualified practice for the taxable year.
7	(b) As used in this section:
8	"Health enterprise zone" means an area designated by the
9	director of health as an area that is underserved by primary
10	health care providers.
11	"Primary health care provider" means:
12	(1) A physician licensed under chapter 453;
13	(2) An advanced practice registered nurse licensed under
14	chapter 457 providing medical primary care; or
15	(3) A dentist licensed under chapter 448 providing dental
16	primary care.
17	"Qualified practice" means a practice at which fifty per
18	cent or more of the total amount received for services at that
19	practice for the taxable year are qualified receipts and fifty
20	per cent or more of the patients whose services are compensated
21	by qualified receipts reside in a health enterprise zone.

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"Qualified primary health care provider" means a primary
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    health care provider with a qualified practice located in a
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    health enterprise zone or within five miles of a health

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         "Qualified receipts" means amounts received for services
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    from the Medicaid program."
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         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $1,000,000 or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be
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    deposited into the health enterprise zone loan program revolving
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    fund.
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         SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the health
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    enterprise zone loan program revolving fund the sum of
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    $1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
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    year 2008-2009 to provide low-interest loans to construct and
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    renovate medical and dental offices and health clinics and
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    purchase medical equipment used by primary health care providers
    serving residents of health enterprise zones within the state,
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    and administer the health enterprise zone loan program.
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         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
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    health for the purposes of this Act.
