A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF BLIND, DEAF, AND DEAF-BLIND PERSONS IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are no current,
- 2 accurate statistics on the number of blind, deaf, and deaf-blind
- 3 persons in the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall conduct
- 5 a survey to determine the number of blind, deaf, and deaf-blind
- 6 persons residing in Hawaii; provided that the department of
- 7 human services may contract with a third party to conduct the
- 8 survey.
- 9 The survey shall determine the total number of blind, deaf,
- 10 and deaf-blind persons residing in the State and residing on
- 11 each island.
- 12 The department shall submit the results of the survey to
- 13 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 14 of the 2009 regular session.
- 15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for a
