A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that small businesses 2 comprise over 96 per cent of all businesses in Hawaii and create 3 83 per cent of all net new jobs in the state. The Hawaii Small 4 Business Development Center Network (Center) assists small 5 businesses by providing high-quality counseling, training, and 6 research services to entrepreneurs and small businesses in the 7 areas of business startup, retention, and expansion through its 8 counseling centers on the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, and 9 Funded in part by a cooperative agreement with the United 10 States Small Business Administration, the Center requires state 11 matching funds and an affiliation with a university or community 12 college. The University of Hawaii at Hilo has been designated as the host institution for the Center 13 14 The Center assists entrepreneurs and small businesses with 15 accessing capital, developing management capabilities, and building financial skills to make their businesses thrive. 16 In 17 addition to providing confidential one-on-one counseling by 18 qualified business professionals free of charge, the network



- 1 also offers a variety of in-class workshops, seminars, and
- 2 online training.
- 3 The legislature further finds that investing in long-term
- 4 business counseling has significant returns. In 2006, the
- 5 Center provided long-term counseling to 255 small businesses and
- 6 aspiring entrepreneurs, helping them obtain \$6,300,000 in
- 7 financing. Long-term counseling generated 42 cents in tax
- 8 revenues for every \$1 spent on the Center's programs in 2006.
- 9 Hence, for every \$1 spent on programs, the Center leveraged
- 10 \$4.82 raised from external sources.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 12 Center to further its mission to create sustainable economic
- 13 development through counseling, training, and research services
- 14 to small businesses and entrepreneurs.
- 15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4 or so much thereof
- 17 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to create
- 18 sustainable economic development through counseling, training,
- 19 and research services at the Hawaii Small Business Development
- 20 Center Network as follows:
- 21 (1) To re-establish a consulting and

7	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the	University of
8	Hawaii fo	r the purposes of this Act.	
9	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July	1, 2020.
