## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE INTERNET.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that our increasingly 2 wired world puts our youth at greater risk for suspicious and dangerous activity on the Internet, such as cyber harassment, 3 4 sexual solicitations, and chatting with strangers online. 5 rapidly growing number of learning and recreational activities on the Internet necessitates a greater role for administrators, teachers, support staff, and parents in ensuring that online 7 8 predators and identity thieves do not prey on our youth. 9 In the State of Michigan alone, over one hundred fifty internet predators seeking to harm Michigan children have been 10 11 arrested since 2003. Thus, in September of 2007, Michigan's 12 attorney general unveiled the nation's most comprehensive internet predator education program for school children. Among 13 14 other things, the Michigan cyber safety initiative provides 15 students with age-appropriate handouts and an online safety 16 contract to discuss with parents or guardians. 17 The purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year

of internet predators by educating students, teachers, and 1 parents about how to avoid online dangers. 2 SECTION 2. The department of the attorney general shall 3 develop and administer a three-year Hawaii cyber safety 4 initiative pilot program with customized presentations for 5 kindergarten through eighth grade students and community 6 seminars. A major focus of the program shall be programming 7 8 designed to protect kindergarten through third grade students. 9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to 11 implement the pilot program; provided that no funds appropriated 12 in this section shall be released unless matched, dollar-for-13 dollar, by private funds. Private funds may be solicited from 14 internet service providers or other corporations supporting in 15 cyber safety. 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 17 18 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
