H.B. NO. 2030

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many children are 1 left unsupervised in the mornings and afternoons before and 2 after school. Nationally, nearly two-thirds of school-age 3 children are in homes where both parents work, but few 4 communities have a comprehensive system that provides before-5 and after-school care for children. Currently, Hawaii has a 6 successful A+ program for students in grades K-6, but does not 7 have a similar program for older children who also need adult 8 supervision. Statistics show that the rates of juvenile crime, 9 drug use, and experimentation with tobacco, alcohol, and sex 10 increase among unsupervised older children during non-school 11 12 hours.

13 The legislature further finds that there is widespread 14 agreement that it is important to establish safe and structured 15 learning environments for school-age children during non-school 16 hours.

1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for non-2 school hour programs for school-age children. 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 5 non-school hour programs for kindergarten through twelfth grades 6 7 for the department of education. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 9 education for the purposes of this section. 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 12 13 the office of youth services for non-school hour programs for 14 children and youth enrolled in school. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 human services for the purposes of this section. 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 18 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 19 20 non-school hour programs for children and youth enrolled in 21 school.

1	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2	parks and recreation of each county, subject to the following
3	allocation percentages, which are based on the number of
4	children eighteen years of age or younger residing in each
5	county; provided that no funds shall be disbursed unless each
6	county provides matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis:
7	(1) Seventy-one per cent, city and county of Honolulu;
8	(2) Thirteen per cent, county of Hawaii;
9	(3) Eleven per cent, county of Maui; and
10	(4) Five per cent, county of Kauai.
11	SECTION 5. Moneys allocated for the purposes of this Act
12	shall not reduce existing funding for non-school hour programs.
13	Moneys shall be awarded by the expending agencies only to non-
14	school hour programs that demonstrate a commitment to partnering
15	with the public and private sectors and involve youth as active
16	participants in all phases of program planning, implementation,
17	and evaluation. All programs that receive those moneys shall
18	meet each quarter with their community partners for the purposes
19	of program evaluation and improvement.
20	SECTION 6. The department of education, the office of
21	youth services, and the counties' parks and recreation
22	departments shall convene annually to share information on the

best practices and outcomes of non-school hour programs. The
office youth services shall submit to the legislature an annual
report on the programs funded under this Act no later than
twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
beginning with the regular session of 2009.

6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
