(a) The determination for eligibility for any 5 public assistance program specified under subsection (b) shall 6 7 disregard in its entirety the value of any asset, owned by the 8 applicant or recipient, including: 9 (1) Personal property; 10 (2) Real property; 11 Automobiles or motor vehicles; (3) (4) Individual development accounts; 12 Individual retirement accounts; 13 (5) Burial spaces and funeral plans; 14 (6) Household goods (for example, appliances, furniture, 15 (7) 16 and televisions);
