A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 "PART VETERAN HEALTH CARE 5 §321-Suicide prevention program; veterans. (a) 6 department of health, in consultation with the director of the 7 office of veterans' services, shall develop and carry out a comprehensive program designed to reduce the incidence of 8 9 suicide among veterans in Hawaii by incorporating the components described in this section. 10 11 Mandatory training for appropriate staff and contractors, including all medical personnel of the department 12 of health who interact with veterans shall be provided. 13 14 training shall cover information appropriate to the duties being performed by such staff and contractors. The training shall 15 include information on: 16
 - (1) Recognizing risk factors for suicide;



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1	(2)	Proper protocols for responding to crisis situations
2		involving veterans who may be at high risk for
3		suicide; and
4	(3)	Best practices for suicide prevention.

- (c) The director of health shall direct that State medical 5
- staff offer mental health in their overall health assessment 6
- 7 when veterans seek medical care at a medical facility, and make
- referrals, at the request of the veteran concerned, to 8
- 9 appropriate counseling and treatment programs for veterans who
- 10 show signs or symptoms of mental health problems.
- The department of health shall designate a suicide 11
- prevention counselor at each state medical facility. Each 12
- 13 counselor shall work with local emergency rooms, police
- 14 departments, mental health organizations, and veterans service
- organizations to engage in outreach to veterans and improve the 15
- coordination of mental health care to veterans. 16
- The department of health shall provide for research on 17
- best practices for suicide prevention among veterans. 18
- 19 shall be conducted under this subsection in consultation with
- 20 the following entities:
- The United States Department of Health and Human 21 (1)
- 22 Services;

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- The National Institute of Mental Health; 1 (2) The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services 2 (3) Administration; and 3 The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. (4) 4 Research on mental health care for veterans who have 5 experienced sexual trauma while in military service shall be 6 7 included in the program. The research design shall include consideration of veterans of a reserve component. 8 Twenty-four-hour mental health care shall be made 9 available to veterans. 10 11 (h) A toll-free hotline for veterans may be established, staffed by appropriately trained mental health personnel, and 12 13 available at all times. (i) Outreach to and education for veterans and the 14 families of veterans, with special emphasis on providing 15 information to veterans of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation 16 Enduring Freedom and the families of such veterans. Education 17 to promote mental health shall include information designed to: 18 19 (1) Remove the stigma associated with mental illness; (2) Encourage veterans to seek treatment and assistance 20 for mental illness; 21
- 22 (3) Promote skills for coping with mental illness; and

- 3 suicide among veterans.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
