A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that polystyrene foam 2 containers provided to customers by restaurants and other food 3 vendors are a hazard to the natural environment. Polystyrene foam containers require fossil fuel to manufacture, contribute 4 5 to litter, and crowd landfills with non-biodegradable waste. The legislature further finds that the State has an interest in 6 7 protecting its natural environment and decreasing the amount of waste flowing into its landfills. The purpose of this Act is to 8 protect the state's natural environment by banning the 9 10 distribution of polystyrene foam containers within the State. SECTION 2. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 13 14 "PART . Polystyrene Foam Containers §342H-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the

1 "Affordable" means purchasable for not more than fifteen 2 per cent more than the purchase cost of a non-biodegradable, 3 non-compostable, or non-recyclable alternative. 4 "ASTM Standard" means meeting the standards of the American 5 Society for Testing and Materials International Standards D6400 6 or D6868 for biodegradable and compostable plastics. 7 "Compostable" means all the materials in the product or 8 package will break down into, or otherwise become part of, 9 usable compost (e.g., soil-conditioning material, mulch) in a 10 safe and timely manner. For the purposes of this part, 11 compostable means that the product or package meets ASTM standards for compostablility. 12 13 "Department" means the department of health. "Director" means the director of health. 14 "Disposable food service ware" means all containers, bowls, 15 16 plates, trays, carton, cups, lids, straws, forks, spoons, 17 knives, napkins and other items that are designed for one-time 18 use for prepared foods, including without limitation, service 19 ware for takeout foods or leftovers from partially consumed 20 meals prepared by food vendors. The term "disposable food 21 service ware" does not include items composed entirely of

- 3 "Food vendor" means any restaurant or retail food vendor
- 4 located or operating within the State.
- 5 "Person" means an individual, trust, firm, joint stock
- 6 company, corporation including a government corporation,
- 7 partnership, limited liability company, or association.
- 8 "Polystyrene foam" means blown polystyrene and expanded and
- 9 extruded foams (sometimes called StyrofoamTM) that are
- 10 thermoplastic petrochemical materials utilizing a styrene
- 11 monomer and processed by any number of techniques including, but
- 12 not limited to, fusion of polymer spheres (expandable bead
- 13 polystyrene), injection molding, foam molding, and extrusion-
- 14 blown molding (extruded foam polystyrene). Polystyrene foam is
- 15 generally used to make cups, bowls, plates, trays, clamshell
- 16 containers, meat trays, and egg cartons.
- "Prepared food" means food or beverages that are serviced,
- 18 packaged, cooked, chopped, sliced, mixed, brewed, frozen,
- 19 squeezed or otherwise prepared within the State for individual
- 20 customers or consumers. For the purpose of this part the term
- 21 includes takeout food, but does not include raw, butchered

- 1 meats, fish, or poultry sold from a butcher case or símilar
- 2 retail appliance.
- 3 "Recyclable" means material that can be sorted, cleansed,
- 4 and reconstituted using available recycling collection programs
- 5 for the purpose of using the altered form in the manufacture of
- 6 a new product. Recycling does not include burning,
- 7 incinerating, converting, or otherwise thermally destroying
- 8 solid waste.
- 9 "Restaurant" means any establishment located within the
- 10 State that sells prepared food for consumption on, near, or off
- 11 its premises. For purposes of this part, the term includes a
- 12 restaurant operating from a temporary facility, cart, vehicle,
- 13 or mobile unit.
- "Retail food vendor" means any store, shop, sales outlet,
- 15 or other establishment, including a grocery store or a
- 16 delicatessen, other than a restaurant, located within the State
- 17 that sells prepared food.
- 18 "State contractors and lessees" means any person or entity
- 19 that has a contract with the State for public works or
- 20 improvements to be performed, for a franchise, concession, or
- 21 lease of property, for grant moneys or goods and services or
- 22 supplies to be purchased at the expense of the State or to be

- 1 paid out of moneys deposited in the general fund or out of trust
- 2 moneys under the control or collected by the State.
- 3 "State facility" means any building, structure, or vehicle
- 4 owned or operated by the State.
- 5 "State facility food provider" means an entity that
- 6 provides, but does not sell, prepared food in state facilities.
- 7 §342H-B Prohibited disposable food service ware. (a) No
- 8 food vendors may sell or otherwise distribute prepared food in
- 9 disposable food service ware that contains polystyrene foam.
- 10 (b) No state facility food provider may provide prepared
- 11 food in disposable food service ware that contains polystyrene
- 12 foam.
- 13 (c) No state department or agency may purchase, acquire,
- 14 or use disposable food service ware that contains polystyrene
- 15 foam.
- (d) No state contractor or lessee may use disposable food
- 17 service ware that contains polystyrene foam in state facilities
- 18 and while performing under a state contract or lease.
- 19 §342H-C Required compostable or recyclable disposable food
- 20 service ware. (a) All food vendors using any disposable food
- 21 service ware shall use a suitable affordable alternative
- 22 compostable or recyclable product, unless there is no suitable

- 1 affordable compostable or recyclable product available as
- 2 determined by the director in accordance with this part.
- 3 (b) All state facility food providers and state facilities
- 4 using any disposable food service ware shall use compostable or
- 5 recyclable disposable food service ware, unless there is no
- 6 affordable compostable product available as determined by the
- 7 director in accordance with this part.
- **8** (c) State contractors and lessees using any disposable
- 9 food service ware shall use suitable compostable or recyclable
- 10 disposable food service ware in state facilities and while
- 11 performing under a state contract or lease, unless there is no
- 12 suitable affordable compostable or recyclable product available
- 13 as determined by the director in accordance with this part.
- 14 §342H-D Implementation. The director shall adopt rules
- 15 under chapter 91 necessary for the purpose of this part. The
- 16 director, by rule, may provide for administrative penalties for
- 17 violations of this part or any rules adopted thereunder.
- 18 §342H-E Waiver. (a) Any person may seek a waiver from
- 19 the requirements of this part by filing a request on a form
- 20 specified by the director.
- 21 (b) The director, consistent with this part, may waive any
- 22 specific requirement of this part for a period of up to one year

- 1 if the person seeking the waiver has demonstrated that strict
- 2 application of the specific requirement would create an undue
- 3 hardship or practical difficulty not generally applicable to
- other persons in similar circumstances. The director's decision 4
- 5 to grant or deny a waiver shall be in writing and shall be
- final." 6
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 8
- 9 begun, before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2010.
