A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SELF-SUFFICIENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the self-sufficiency
- 2 standard is the actual amount needed to afford minimum basic
- 3 needs such as food, housing, and healthcare. The legislature
- 4 also finds that the self-sufficiency standard is a more
- 5 realistic guide for evaluating programs, designing new policies,
- 6 and setting benchmarks for measuring economic success for the
- 7 State of Hawaii.
- 8 In 2003, the commission on the status of women funded a
- 9 report, The Self-Sufficiency Report for Hawaii, which provided
- 10 an in-depth study of the actual cost to live in Hawaii in nine
- 11 communities throughout the State. The self-sufficiency
- 12 standards in this study ranged from double to triple the federal
- 13 poverty guidelines.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish a self-sufficiency
- 15 standard, to be updated biannually, to be used to determine the
- 16 level of public assistance.

1 SECTION 2. Section 201-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§201-3 Specific research and promotional functions of the

4 department. Without prejudice to its general functions and

5 duties the department of business, economic development, and

6 tourism shall have specific functions in the following areas:

(1) Industrial development. The department shall determine through technical and economic surveys the profit potential of new or expanded industrial undertakings; develop through research projects and other means new and improved industrial products and processes; promote studies and surveys to determine consumer preference as to design and quality and to determine the best methods of packaging, transporting, and marketing the State's industrial products; disseminate information to assist the present industries of the State, to attract new industries to the State, and to encourage capital investment in present and new industries in the State; assist associations of producers and distributors of industrial products to introduce [such] these products to consumers; and make [such] grants or contracts as

- Land development. - 2 development, and tourism shall report to the legislature with
- 3 the self-sufficiency standard no later than twenty days prior to
- 4 the convening of the regular session of 2009, and annually
- 5 thereafter.
- 6 SECTION 4. The department of business, economic
- 7 development, and tourism shall periodically advise and make
- 8 recommendations for the utilization of any federal funding
- 9 including, but not limited to, Temporary Assistance for Needy
- 10 Families and Workforce Investment Act funds that may be
- 11 available for the purposes of establishing and updating the self
- 12 sufficiency standards.
- 13 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 16 the department of business, economic development, and tourism to
- 17 hire one staff position to establish and update the self-
- 18 sufficiency standard.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 20 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 21 this Act.
