A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC ASSISTANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a self-sufficiency 2 standard that is measured appropriately and updated consistently 3 for the State of Hawaii would much more accurately reflect the 4 actual income needed to afford the basic necessities of life. 5 In 2003, a study conducted for the Hawaii state commission on 6 the status of women calculated the bare-minimum costs for 7 housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, clothing 8 and household costs, and federal and state tax obligations. 9 study resulted in a measure designed to document a cost of 10 living standard that takes into account family size, children's 11 ages, geography, and number of household wage-earners. 12 study found that certain households in Hawaii could require as 13 much as double to triple the amount listed in the federal 14 poverty guidelines to meet their basic living needs. A self-15 sufficiency standard for Hawaii would be an excellent tool for 16 lawmakers, the business and education community, and the

- 5 SECTION 2. Section 201-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:

6	(2)	Land development. The department shall encourage the
7		most productive use of all land in the State in
8		accordance with a general plan developed by the
9		department; encourage the improvement of land tenure
10		practices on leased private lands; promote an
11		informational program directed to landowners,
12		producers of agricultural and industrial commodities,
13		and the general public regarding the most efficient
14		and most productive use of the lands in the State; and
15		make such grants or contracts as may be necessary or
16		advisable to accomplish the foregoing;
17	(3)	Credit development. The department shall conduct a
18		continuing study of agricultural and industrial credit
19		needs; encourage the development of additional private
20		and public credit sources for agricultural and
21		industrial enterprises; promote an informational
22		program to acquaint financial institutions with

	agricultural and industrial credit needs and the
	potential for agricultural and industrial expansion,
	and inform producers of agricultural and industrial
	products as to the manner in which to qualify for
	loans; and make such grants or contracts as may be
	necessary or advisable to accomplish the foregoing;
(4)	Promotion. The department shall disseminate
	information developed for or by the department
	pertaining to economic development to assist present
	industry in the State, attract new industry and
	investments to the State, and assist new and emerging
	industry with good growth potential or prospects in
	jobs, exports, and new products. The industrial and
	economic promotional activities of the department may
	include the use of literature, advertising,

	promotional and publicity devices as may be

(5)	Tourism research and statistics. The department shall

- 1 SECTION 3. The department of business, economic
- 2 development, and tourism shall report to the legislature with
- 3 the first self-sufficiency standard no later than twenty days
- 4 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009, and
- 5 provide the legislature with biannual self-sufficiency standard
- 6 updates thereafter.
- 7 SECTION 4. The department of business, economic
- 8 development, and tourism shall recommend the procurement or use
- 9 of federal monies whenever appropriate to establish and update
- 10 biannually the self-sufficiency standard.
- 11 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
- 14 create one full-time staff position within the department of
- 15 business, economic development, and tourism to establish and
- 16 update biannually the self-sufficiency standard.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

2 provided that section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
