A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 328, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§32</u>	8- Dispensing refills for prescriptions during a
5	state of	emergency or disaster. (a) Any other law to the
6	contrary	notwithstanding, in the event of a declared state of
7	disaster	or state of emergency in the State, time restrictions
8	on fillin	g or refilling prescriptions for a prescription drug
9	may be wa	ived if requested by the covered person or subscriber.
10	<u>A prescri</u>	ption drug may be dispensed or refilled to:
11	(1)	Obtain one refill on a prescription if there are
12		authorized refills remaining; or
13	(2)	Fill one replacement prescription for one that was
14		recently filled, as prescribed or approved by the
15		prescriber of the prescription that is being replaced
16		and not contrary to the dispensing authority of the
17		dispensing pharmacy.



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1	(b)	Payment to pharmacies for any prescription dispensed	
2	in accord	ance with subsection (a) shall be authorized by the	
3	insurer r	egardless of the date upon which the prescription had	
4	most rece	ntly been filled by a pharmacist, if:	
5	(1)	The governor declares a state of disaster or state of	
6		emergency in the State or the president of the United	
7		States declares a major disaster under the Robert T.	
8		Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act,	
9		42 U.S.C. §5121, et seq., as amended;	
10	(2)	The covered person requesting coverage of the refill	
11		or replacement prescription resides in a county that	
12		is covered under a declaration of state of disaster or	
13		state of emergency issued by the governor or by a	
14		declaration of major disaster issued by the President	
15		of the United States; and	
16	(3)	The prescription drug is requested within twenty-nine	
17		days after the date of the declaration of disaster or	
18		emergency.	
19	<u>(c)</u>	The time period for the waiver of dispensing	
20	prescript	ion drug refills may be extended in thirty day	
21	increment	s by an order issued by the director. Additional	
22	refills s	till remaining on a prescription shall be covered by	
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1	the insurer as long as consistent with the orders of the		
2	prescriber or authority of the dispensing pharmacy.		
3	(d) This section does not excuse or exempt an insured or		
4	subscriber from any other terms of the policy or certificate		
5	providing coverage for prescription medications.		
6	(e) Quantity limitations shall be consistent with the		
7	original prescription and the extra or replacement fill may		
8	recognize proportionate dosage use prior to the disaster.		
9	(f) No requirements additional to those under the		
10	pharmacy-provider agreement or the prescription benefit plan may		
11	be placed upon the provider for coverage of the replacement fill

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1	SECT	ION 3. Online emergency prescription database. (a)
2	The direc	tor of health is directed to convene a collaborative
3	work grou	p to establish an online emergency prescription
4	database	to provide licensed prescribers and pharmacists caring
5	for victi	ms of a state of emergency or state of disaster with
6	secure ac	cess to patients' comprehensive medication history.
7	The work	group shall convene no later than September 1, 2008,
8	and shall	include representatives of:
9	(1)	Health care providers;
10	(2)	Licensed prescribers;
11	(3)	Pharmacists;
12	(4)	Health care insurers;
13	(5)	Health information technology hardware and software
14		providers or developers;
15	(6)	State medicaid programs;
16	(7)	State and county agencies that coordinate or provide
17		emergency medical systems;
18	(8)	Health care facilities;
19	(9)	The department of health;
20	(10)	The department of human services;
21	(11)	The insurance commissioner; and
22	(12)	Consumers of prescription drugs.



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1 The work group shall review the establishment, (b) implementation, and maintenance of the existing online resource, 2 3 the In Case of Emergency Prescription Database (ICERx), at ICERx.org, and shall consult with the contributing partners of 4 5 ICERx, the American Medical Association, Informed Decisions, the 6 National Association of Chain Drug Stores, the National 7 Community Pharmacists Association, RxHub, SureScripts, and other 8 relevant public and private organizations on issues relating to 9 the establishment and implementation of an online emergency prescription database. Currently, ICERx provides a centralized 10 11 place to record and retrieve medication information on patients 12 dislocated during a disaster and to improve information exchange 13 between health care providers caring for these patients. After 14 reviewing ICERx and consulting with its partners, the work group 15 shall determine whether it would be more effective and practical 16 to:

17 (1) Establish a similar online emergency prescription18 database in the State; or

19 (2) Mandate participation in ICERx by health care
20 professionals, including licensed prescribers and
21 pharmacists, and appropriate state and county agencies



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and develop an educational program relating to the 1 2 access and availability of ICERx for consumers. 3 An emergency prescription database shall be operational in the State no later than July 1, 2009. 4 The work group shall submit a report to the 5 (C)6 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009 on the establishment and 7 implementation of an online emergency prescription database in 8 9 the State. The work group shall cease to exist on June 30, 10 2009. 11 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the 14 establishment and implementation of an online emergency prescription database to provide licensed prescribers and 15

16 pharmacists in the State with medication information for 17 disaster victims.

18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 19 health for the purposes of this Act.



Prescriptions; Refills; Disaster; Online Emergency Rx Database

Description:

Authorizes refills for prescriptions during disasters. Directs the director of health to convene a work group to establish an online emergency prescription database. Appropriation.
