## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTIO	N 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read	as follows:
4	" <u>§304A</u>	- Hawaii rural physician loan program. (a)
5	There is cr	eated the Hawaii rural physician loan program to be
6	administere	d by the University of Hawaii in partnership with a
7	financial i	nstitution whose operations are principally conducted
8	in Hawaii.	The program shall provide loans to five nonresident
9	students pe	r year who:
10	<u>(1)</u> H	ave been given a nonresident tuition waiver pursuant
11	<u>t</u>	o section 304A-502;
12	<u>(2)</u> A	re or will be enrolled in an education and training
13	<u>p</u>	rogram for physicians administered by the University
14	<u>o</u>	f Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine that leads
15	<u>t</u>	o eligibility for a license under chapter 453; and
16	<u>(3)</u> A	gree to practice as a licensed physician within six
17	<u>m</u>	onths of completion of their residency:

1	<u>(</u>	In a rural health professional shortage area for
2		a minimum of three consecutive years; or
3	<u>(</u> E	In a nonrural health professional shortage area
4		for a minimum of five consecutive years.
5	Rural and no	onrural health professional shortage areas shall be
6	designated b	by the department of health by rule.
7	Each lo	an shall be made to cover the cost of resident
8	tuition nece	essary to complete the education and training program
9	under subsec	tion (a)(2); provided that the total amount of a
10	loan to any	individual shall not exceed the cost of five years
11	of resident	tuition.
12	(b) Lo	an repayment obligations under the Hawaii rural
13	physician lo	an program shall be forgiven and considered a grant
14	under the fo	ollowing conditions and in the following amounts plus
15	interest acc	rued on that amount:
16	<u>(1)</u> Fo	er loan recipients employed as licensed physicians in
17	<u>a</u>	rural health professional shortage area of the
18	st	ate, one-third of the total amount owed and unpaid
19	sh	all be forgiven for each year employed; or
20	<u>(2)</u> Fo	er loan recipients employed as licensed physicians in
21	a	nonrural health professional shortage area of the

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1	state, one fifth of the total amount owed and unpaid
2	shall be forgiven for each year employed.
3	(c) Beginning three months after the loan recipient fails
4	to complete the enrollment requirement under subsection (a)(2),
5	or service obligation under subsection (a)(3), a loan recipient
6	shall repay three times the amount of the outstanding loan in
7	periodic installments within a period not to exceed seven years.
8	The University of Hawaii may charge late fees and all other
9	reasonable costs for the collection of delinquent loans.
10	(d) Repayment under subsection (c) shall be deferred for a
11	loan recipient who is performing a service obligation imposed by
12	the National Health Service Corps or the Uniformed Service
13	Scholarship Program. The University of Hawaii may waive or
14	adjust the conditions of repayment of a loan under subsection
15	(c) for loan recipients who fail to meet their service
16	obligation for good cause. Liability for repayment of a loan
17	shall be canceled upon the death or permanent total disability
18	of the borrower. As used in this subsection, "total disability"
19	shall have the same meaning as "person totally disabled" as
20	defined under section 235-1.
21	(e) The University of Hawaii may enter into written
22	contracts with collection agencies for the purpose of collecting



- 1 delinquent loans or nonresident tuition and fees owed in
- 2 accordance with chapter 103D. All loan payments collected,
- 3 exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert and
- 4 be credited to the Hawaii rural physician loan program special
- 5 fund. A collection agency that enters into a written contract
- 6 with the University of Hawaii pursuant to this section for the
- 7 collection of delinquent loans may collect a commission from the
- 8 debtor in accordance with the terms of, and up to the amounts
- 9 authorized in the written contract.
- 10 (f) There is established in the treasury of the State the
- 11 Hawaii rural physician loan program special fund to be
- 12 administered by the University of Hawaii. Any funds
- 13 appropriated by the legislature for the program, gifts,
- 14 donations, and grants from public agencies and private persons,
- 15 loan payments, proceeds of the operations of the program, and
- 16 interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited in the fund shall
- 17 become a part of the fund.
- 18 The University of Hawaii may expend moneys from the fund
- 19 for the purposes of this section."
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 304A-502, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

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1	"[#]	§304A-502[] Power of regents to grant tuition
2	waivers.	(a) The board of regents, or its designated
3	represent	atives, is authorized to grant, modify, or suspend
4	tuition w	aivers.
5	The	board may:
6	(1)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
7		other fees for graduate teaching and research
8		assistants;
9	(2)	Enter into agreements with government and university
10		officials of any other state or foreign country to
11		provide for reciprocal waiver of the nonresident
12		tuition and fee differential;
13	(3)	Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
14		selected students from Pacific and Asian jurisdictions
15		when their presence would be beneficial to the
16		university or the State;
17	(4)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
18		other fees for students, resident or nonresident; and
19	(5)	Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
20		members in good standing of the following military
21		units, regardless of their actual state of residence:
22		(A) The Hawaii national guard; and

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1	(B) The federal reserve components of the Army, Navy
2	Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard who
3	attend drills with units located within the
4	State.
5	(b) The board of regents shall waive the nonresident
6	tuition and fee differential for five nonresident students of
7	the John A. Burns School of Medicine per year for not more than
8	five years. The waiver shall be conditioned on the agreement of
9	the nonresident student to meet the enrollment requirements and
10	service obligations set forth under section 304A- (a)(2) and
11	<u>(3).</u>
12	(c) The board shall determine the percentage of allowable
13	tuition and fee waivers for financial need and other university
14	priorities. These tuition waivers and waivers of the
15	nonresident tuition and fee differential shall be awarded in
16	accordance with guidelines established by the board."
17	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
19	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be
20	deposited into the Hawaii rural physician loan program fund.
21	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
22	health for the purposes of this Act.
