BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 706-660.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§706-660.2 Sentence of imprisonment for offenses against 4 children, elder persons, or handicapped persons. 5 Notwithstanding section 706-669, a person who, in the course of 6 committing or attempting to commit a felony, causes the death or inflicts serious or substantial bodily injury upon a person who 7 8 [is:] has the status of being: 9 (1)Sixty years of age or older; 10 (2)Blind, a paraplegic, or a quadriplegic; [or] 11 Eight years of age or younger; or (3)12 (4) Pregnant; 13 and [such disability] the person's status is known or reasonably should be known to the defendant, shall, if not subjected to an 14 15 extended term of imprisonment pursuant to section 706-662, be sentenced to a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment without 16 possibility of parole as follows: 17
- 18 (1) For murder in the second degree--fifteen years;

- 1 (2) For a class A felony--six years, eight months;
- 2 (3) For a class B felony--three years, four months;
- 3 (4) For a class C felony--one year, eight months."
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun, before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
