A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the development of 2 an electronic citation system for traffic and other types of 3 violations would significantly enhance public safety and law 4 enforcement services. An increasing number of law enforcement agencies throughout the nation are implementing electronic 5 6 citation systems. For the city and county of Honolulu, the cost 7 of implementing an electronic system comprised of hardware, 8 software, and programming to capture, manage, and share citation 9 data has been estimated at \$1,500,000.

10 The legislature also finds that an electronic citation 11 system that allows the counties and the judiciary to share 12 information on traffic violations would provide timely 13 information for law enforcement agencies and make available 14 information on a real-time basis for investigations.

15 The purpose of this Act is to provide a source of funding 16 for the establishment and maintenance of an electronic citation 17 system through an administrative fee of \$4 per citation issued 18 for violations of the statewide traffic code.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§291C-A Traffic violation administrative fee. Effective
5	July 1, 2009, an administrative fee of \$4 shall be assessed on
6	each citation issued for a violation of chapter 291C; provided
7	that owners of U-drive vehicles shall only be responsible for
8	administrative fees of their renters or lessees as provided for
9	in section 291D-3.5. Revenue from the administrative fee shall
10	fund the establishment and maintenance of an electronic citation
11	system. All revenue collected pursuant to this section shall be
12	deposited into the electronic citation system special fund
13	established in section 291C-B.
14	<u>§291C-B</u> Electronic citation system special fund. (a)
15	There is established in the state treasury a special fund to be
16	known as the electronic citation system special fund to be
17	administered by the department of budget and finance. Any funds
18	appropriated by the legislature for the electronic citation
19	system, administrative fees assessed under section 291C-A, and
20	interest accrued on moneys deposited in the fund shall become a
21	part of the fund. Moneys in the fund or disbursed from the fund



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1	pursuant to subsection (b) shall be expended to establish an
2	electronic citation system.
3	(b) Administrative fees deposited in the fund pursuant to
4	section 291C-A shall be shared equally by the judiciary and the
5	county police department that issued the citation. Effective
6	July 1, 2009, the director of finance shall transmit not more
7	than thirty days after the end of each fiscal quarter, fifty per
8	cent of the administrative fee assessed on each citation to:
9	(1) The county police department that issued the citation;
10	and
11	(2) The judiciary computer special fund established under
12	section 601-3.7."
13	SECTION 3. Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	"§36-27 Transfers from special funds for central service
16	expenses. Except as provided in this section, and
17	notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, from time to
18	time, the director of finance, for the purpose of defraying the
19	prorated estimate of central service expenses of government in
20	relation to all special funds, except the:

4	shall deduct five per cent of all receipts of all other special
5	funds, which deduction shall be transferred to the general fund
6	of the State and become general realizations of the State. All
7	officers of the State and other persons having power to allocate
8	or disburse any special funds shall cooperate with the director
9	in effecting these transfers. To determine the proper revenue
10	base upon which the central service assessment is to be
11	calculated, the director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
12	91 for the purpose of suspending or limiting the application of
13	the central service assessment of any fund. No later than
14	twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session of
15	the legislature, the director shall report all central service
16	assessments made during the preceding fiscal year."
17	SECTION 4. Section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2009.

Traffic Violations; Administrative Fee; Electronic Citations

Description:

Authorizes a \$4 administrative fee on all citations for traffic code violations to be shared by the judiciary and the counties for the establishment and maintenance of an electronic citation system. Establishes the electronic citation system special fund. Provides alternative payment for rental car companies. Provides for the disbursement of the funds to the counties and the Judiciary Computer Special Fund. Effective January 1, 2009. (HB2343 HD1)
