A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that teacher licensing
 2 requirements in Hawaii differ from teacher licensing
 3 requirements under the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001
- 4 (Public Law 107-110), which requires all schools to have
- 5 teachers who are considered "highly qualified" in core academic
- 6 subjects, such as English, reading or language arts,
- 7 mathematics, science, foreign languages, civics and government,
- $oldsymbol{8}$ economics, arts, history, and geography. The differing
- $oldsymbol{9}$ requirements have resulted in confusion among teachers and
- 10 administrators. It also potentially jeopardizes federal Title
- 11 IIA funding, which stipulates that all teachers in each state
- 12 who teach core academic subjects meet federal requirements.
- 13 The purpose of this Act to clarify that Hawaii's teacher
- 14 licensure requirements need to be aligned with federal licensure
- 15 requirements and to improve the delivery of services to
- 16 students.
- 17 SECTION 2. The Hawaii teacher standards board shall make

- 21 SECTION 3. The department of education and the Hawaii 22 teacher standards board shall share data and collaborate on the

Section 302A-804, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "\$302A-804 Powers and duties of the department. The department shall retain all of its rights and powers except for 6 7 the authority provided to the board under this subpart. The 8 department's powers and duties under this subpart shall be 9 limited to: (1) Hiring, except in emergency situations as described in 10 11 this chapter, licensed teachers to teach in their 12 fields of licensing; 13 Reporting data annually to the board about the supply (2) of, and demand for, teachers, including the 14 15 identification of shortage areas, out-of-field 16 teaching assignments, numbers of teachers teaching 17 out-of-field, numbers and types of courses and classes taught by out-of-field teachers, and numbers and types 18 of students taught by out-of-field teachers; 19 20 (3) On an emergency and case-by-case basis, hiring

20		(D)	The department's efforts to address the shortages
21			described in subparagraph (A); and

Report Title:

Education; Teacher Licensing; Teacher Standards

Description:

Directs the department of education and the Hawaii teacher standards board to adopt new administrative rules to align state and federal teacher licensing requirements. Reduces the number of years an individual may be employed as a teacher on an emergency basis from 4 to 3.
