A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ISLAND OF KAHO'OLAWE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 340, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993, mandated 1 2 that the island of Kaho'olawe be reserved in perpetuity for uses 3 such as: the preservation and practice of rights customarily 4 and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for cultural, 5 spiritual, and subsistence purposes; the preservation and 6 protection of the island's archaeological, historical, and 7 environmental resources; and education. Accordingly, the 8 Kaho'olawe island reserve commission plans to establish culture 9 and education centers, operations facilities, overnight 10 campsites, restoration areas, and cultural and wildlife 11 preserves on the island. 12 Because Kaho'olawe is geographically and logistically 13 isolated from the other Hawaiian islands, concerns have emerged 14 regarding appropriate power sources and adequate fuel supplies 15 to successfully maintain planned facilities and operations. In keeping with the Kaho'olawe island reserve commission's 16

mandate and vision to restore, preserve, and maintain a pristine natural environment on the island, the use of alternative energy HB HMS 2007-4869



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- 1 resources for the island's power needs should be considered.
- 2 The State is in the unique position of establishing Kaho'olawe
- 3 as a model project for sustainability and alternative energy
- 4 research and application that can be utilized to plan for the
- 5 future power needs of not only Kaho'olawe, but the entire State
- 6 as well. In this regard, the Hawaii State Planning Act, chapter
- 7 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, identifies increased energy self-
- 8 sufficiency as one of the State's energy objectives.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to direct the auditor to
- 10 determine the feasibility of deploying alternative energy
- 11 resources to meet the island's energy needs and submit a report
- 12 of findings and recommendations to the legislature and governor
- 13 before the convening of the regular session of 2009.
- 14 SECTION 2. The auditor shall conduct an audit to determine
- 15 the feasibility of deploying alternative energy resources on the
- 16 island of Kaho'olawe. The audit shall identify feasible
- 17 alternative energy resources and shall include a cost analysis,
- 18 assessment, and an implementation strategy for the utilization
- 19 of alternative energy resources to address the current and
- 20 future energy needs of the island.
- 21 SECTION 3. The auditor shall submit findings and
- 22 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the

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- 1 legislature and the governor no later than twenty days prior to
- 2 the convening of the regular session of 2009.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
