A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately

designated and to read as follows:

HAWAII MEDICAL DOCTOR LOANS

5 §304A-A Hawaii medical doctor loans; eligibility; amounts.

There is created the Hawaii medical doctor loan program to be 6 7 administered by the University of Hawaii, to provide financial 8 support to students who complete a state-approved medical school program at the University of Hawaii and who agree to practice in 9 10 rural areas of the state, as designated by the University of 11 Hawaii. Eligibility shall be awarded by the university to 12 students on a competitive basis. The amount to be loaned to a 13 student shall be determined by the board of regents based upon need for financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-14 approved medical school program at the university. The maximum 15 amount of loans that a student may receive under this program 16 17 shall be an aggregate amount equivalent to tuition payments and

costs of textbooks and other instructional and laboratory



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- 1 materials necessary to complete a state-approved medical school
- 2 program.
- 3 §304A-B Repayment of loans; waiver; collection. (a) All
- 4 loans made under this subpart shall bear interest at five per
- 5 cent simple interest. Repayment of principal and interest
- 6 charges shall commence one year after graduation or three months
- 7 after a loan recipient ceases to be enrolled in a state-approved
- 8 medical school program at the university and shall be paid in
- 9 periodic installments within a six-year period. The university
- 10 may charge late fees and all other reasonable costs for the
- 11 collection of delinquent loans.
- 12 (b) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has
- 13 completed a state-approved medical school program and is
- 14 practicing as a medical doctor in a rural area of the State, as
- 15 designated by the university, one-tenth of the total amount of
- 16 the loan and interest shall be waived for every year of the
- 17 first five years, and the remaining balance shall be waived
- 18 after the sixth year that a loan recipient practices medicine in
- 19 a rural area of the State, as designated by the University of
- 20 Hawaii.

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- 1 (c) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled
- 2 upon the death or permanent total disability of the loan
- 3 recipient.
- 4 (d) If a loan recipient subject to this section fails to
- 5 practice medicine in a rural area of the State, as designated by
- 6 the university, for a minimum of ten consecutive years from the
- 7 loan recipient's original date of employment with the
- 8 university, excluding temporary leaves of absence, then the loan
- 9 recipient shall repay any remaining loan balance at the rate of
- 10 ten per cent simple interest.
- 11 (e) In accordance with chapter 103D, the university may
- 12 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the
- 13 purpose of collecting delinquent student loans. All payments
- 14 collected, exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall
- 15 revert, and be credited, to the special fund established for the
- 16 Hawaii medical doctor loan program. A collection agency that
- 17 enters into a written contract with the university for the
- 18 collection of delinquent student loans, pursuant to this
- 19 section, may collect a commission from the debtor in accordance
- 20 with the terms of, and up to the amounts authorized in, the
- 21 written contract.

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§304A-C Capacity of minors in qualifying for Hawaii 1 2 medical doctor loans. Any student otherwise qualifying for a 3 loan under the Hawaii medical doctor loan program revolving fund 4 shall not be disqualified because the student is under the age 5 of eighteen years, and for the purpose of applying for, 6 receiving, and repaying the loan, any such person shall be 7 deemed to have full legal capacity to act and shall have all 8 rights, powers, privileges, and obligations of an adult with 9 respect thereto. 10 §304A-D Rules governing Hawaii medical doctor loan program 11 special fund. The university may adopt rules to implement the 12 Hawaii medical doctor loan program. The rules shall be adopted 13 pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the public 14 notice and public hearing requirements. 15 §304A-E Medical doctor loan revolving fund. There is 16 established a revolving fund to be known as the medical doctor loan fund. The fund shall be a revolving fund and all interest 17 and payments received on account of principal shall be credited 18 19 to the fund. The fund shall be administered by the board of 20 regents and shall be disbursed to qualified students who meet 21 eligibility requirements under section 304A-A pursuant to rules

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adopted by the board."

1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 3 deposit into the medical doctor loan revolving fund established 4 by this Act. 5 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the medical doctor loan revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as 7 may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the purposes of 8 this Act. 9 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 11 12 SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 13 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 14 the new sections in this Act. 15 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008. 17
