A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COUNTY FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "§46- Cruise ship passengers; environmental and impact 5 fees; amounts; usage of fees; prior legislative approval 6 required. (a) A county may impose, subject to subsection (e), 7 a resource user fee and an environmental impact fee on the owner 8 of a cruise ship carrying passengers if the cruise ship is 9 berthed in waters of the county within a harbor, at a pier, or 10 otherwise docked in the county. 11 (b) The amount of the: 12 (1) Resource user fee shall be based on the ratio of 13 per every five hundred passengers; and Environmental impact fee shall be based on the ratio 14 (2) of \$ per every five hundred passengers 15 who disembark from the cruise ship while the ship is in the 16 17 county on each complete cruise ship voyage.

1	(c) The resource user fee shall be used to offset county
2	expenses incurred for the provision of direct services to
3	passengers of the cruise ship, including but not limited to
4	police, transportation, emergency medical, rescue and
5	evacuation, and other services provided by entities or personnel
6	employed by the county using county resources.
7	(d) All fees imposed and collected pursuant to this
8	section shall be used solely in areas of the county that are
9	identified by the county as being directly affected by the
10	visitor industry.
11	(e) A county is prohibited from imposing the fees under
12	this section unless first authorized by the legislature through
13	a separate legislative act."
14	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

County Resource User and Environmental Impact Fees; Cruise Ships

Description:

Allows counties to impose resource user fee and environmental impact fees on cruise ship owners based on \$ per 500 disembarking passengers. Restricts use of fees to areas directly affected by tourism. Requires prior legislative approval before county may impose fees.
