
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 183D-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) The hunting license fee shall be:

4 (1) \$10 for any person who has resided in the State for
5 one year or longer, or who is a member of the armed
6 forces of the United States on active duty and the
7 spouse and children thereof, or who elects to forgo
8 the exemption provided in paragraph [~~(3)~~] (4);

9 (2) \$95 for all other persons; [~~and~~]

10 (3) \$95 for persons who do not meet the requirements of
11 paragraph (1) or (4) for a seven-day period for
12 hunting on a private or commercial shooting preserve;
13 and

14 [~~(3)~~] (4) Free to all Hawaii residents sixty-five years of
15 age or older and to all persons with Hansen's disease
16 who are residents of Kalaupapa, Molokai."

17 SECTION 2. Section 183D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended to read as follows:



1 "§183D-23 Licenses expire when. All licenses shall expire
2 on June 30 next following the date of issuance[-], except for
3 licenses obtained pursuant to section 183D-22(b)(3)."

4 SECTION 3. Section 183D-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

6 "(b) A person who meets the minimum age requirements
7 adopted pursuant to subsection (c) shall be exempt from the
8 requirements of subsection (a) if the person:

- 9 (1) Was born before January 1, 1972, and at one time
10 possessed a hunting license issued by the State;
11 provided that the person shows satisfactory proof to
12 the department that the person had possessed the
13 hunting license; [~~or~~]
- 14 (2) Has successfully completed a course or program of
15 hunter education and safety [~~which~~] that is approved
16 by the International Hunter Education Association and
17 meets the requirements of chapter 12 of the United
18 States Fish and Wildlife Service Federal Aid Manual,
19 as revised; provided that the person shows
20 satisfactory proof in the form of a certificate,
21 wallet card, or other document issued by a state,



1 province, or country evidencing successful completion
2 of the course or program[-]; or

3 (3) Obtains a seven-day hunting license pursuant to
4 section 183D-22(b) (3) to hunt on a private or
5 commercial shooting preserve, accompanied by a
6 hunting guide licensed pursuant to section 183D-25.5.

7 Upon application and satisfaction of the requirements of
8 paragraph (1), the department shall issue a written exemption
9 [which] that shall be valid for the life of the person. The
10 department shall develop and maintain a list of approved hunter
11 education courses described in paragraph (2) for reference by
12 the public and license agents."

13 SECTION 4. Section 183D-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

15 "(b) The fee for [~~the license shall be \$1;~~] private and
16 commercial shooting preserve and farmers' licenses shall be set
17 by the department; provided that the department may authorize
18 any governmental agency to breed and sell [~~such~~] game birds, and
19 may authorize any person to possess lawfully obtained game
20 birds. The fees collected under this subsection shall be
21 deposited into the wildlife revolving fund under section
22 183D-10.5."



1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
