A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part XXXII to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§321- Tainted food for humans and pets; detection
5	and handling procedures. (a) The department of health shall
6	establish procedures to accept reports from a person who has
7	reason to believe that any food product:
8	(1) Introduced into or in interstate commerce; or
9	(2) Held for sale after shipment in interstate commerce,
10	may be tainted with harmful bacteria or other organisms that
11	have the potential to create a serious public health risk to
12	humans or pet animals, as defined in section 711-1100, that
13	consume the food product.
14	(b) Upon receiving a report of tainted food products, the
15	department of health shall perform a thorough investigation and
16	upon finding that any food products are a significant public
17	health risk, the department of health shall notify

manufacturers, importers, distributors, and retailers, of the

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food, as	the department of health finds necessary, to take
appropria	te action, including:
(1)	Stopping distribution;
(2)	Notifying all persons to which the food has been
	distributed, transported, or sold, of the department
	of health's findings and recommended actions;
(3)	Recalling the food; or
(4)	Taking any combination of the measures described in
	this paragraph, as determined by the department of
	health to be appropriate to address the situation.
(c)	Any person that violates the notification and recall
standards	established by the department of health under
subsectio	n (b) may be assessed a penalty by the department of
health of	not more than \$10,000 as determined by the department
of health	for each separate act and separate day during which
the viola	tion continues. The penalty shall be assessed by the
departmen	t of health by a written order that shall specify the
amount of	the penalty and the basis for the penalty.

- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
