A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to rea	ad as follows:	
4	" <u>§34</u>	6- Child abuse or neglect; unannounced departmental	
5	inspection	n visits. (a) Beginning July 1, 2008, the department	
6	shall be	authorized to conduct one or more unannounced visits to	
7	the paren	tal home in which a child lives:	
8	(1)	If a member of the household in which the child lives	
9		has been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony offense	
10		relating to child abuse or neglect against the child	
11		or adjudicated for conduct that would constitute such	
12		an offense under section 571-11(1); and	
13	(2)	When the child has been returned to that parental home	
14		for at least three months but not more than six	
15		months,	
16	to conduc	t interviews and to inspect the conditions within the	
17	parental	home for signs or evidence of further actual or	

1	potential	child abuse or neglect, as defined in section 350-1 to	
2	ensure the well being of the child.		
3	(b)	The inspector shall prepare a written report upon	
4	completion	n of the interviews and inspection. If, in the opinion	
5	of the in	spector:	
6	(1)	The child is in imminent harm, the report shall be	
7		referred for immediate action by the department;	
8	(2)	The inspection is inconclusive, a follow up inspection	
9		shall be conducted no later than twenty-one days	
10		thereafter; or	
11	(3)	The child is in no danger of harm or imminent harm, no	
12		further action shall be taken.	
13	(C)	For purposes of this section, "convicted" means	
14	judgment has been entered against a person on a verdict or a		
15	finding of guilty, or on a plea of guilty or nolo contendere."		
16	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a well child follow-		
17	up visit pilot project within the department of human services		
18	to provide for a well child visit with families who have been		
19	investigated by child welfare services, pursuant to section 587		
20	21, Hawai	i Revised Statutes, to ensure the continued safety and	
21	well-being	g of the child, subject to the appropriation of general	

- 1 funds for the pilot project. The pilot project shall apply to
- 2 both confirmed and unconfirmed cases of child abuse and neglect.
- 3 (b) The well child follow-up visit pilot project may
- 4 include conducting a well child follow-up visit for each child
- 5 in cases where physical or sexual abuse or neglect has been
- 6 alleged and investigated.
- 7 (c) The well child follow-up visit may be conducted no
- 8 earlier than six months, but within one year, after the
- 9 completion of the investigation.
- 10 (d) The department of human services or its designated
- 11 contractor shall provide well child follow-up visits, subject to
- 12 the appropriation of general funds for this pilot project, on a
- 13 case-by-case basis. The department may contract with an
- 14 appropriate entity to provide these services.
- 15 (e) The pilot project shall cease to exist on June 30,
- 16 2009. The department of human services shall submit a report on
- 17 the status of the pilot project to the legislature no later than
- 18 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 19 2009 and a final report no later than twenty days prior to the
- 20 convening of the regular session of 2010.
- 21 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much

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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the
- 2 well child follow-up visit pilot project.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Report Title:

Child Abuse or Neglect; Unannounced Visits for Inspection

Description:

Authorizes the Department of Human Services to conduct unannounced visits to inspect a parental home in which a household member was convicted or adjudicated for certain offenses of child abuse or neglect. Establishes a Well Child Follow-up Visit Pilot Project. (HB2558 HD1)
