A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health care is an essential component of the overall health and well-being 2 of every resident of Hawaii. Unfortunately, there is a severe 3 shortage of mental health specialists available to provide these 4 much-needed services, particularly in rural communities and 5 6 neighbor islands. This shortage has resulted in primary care physicians shouldering the responsibility of managing 7 psychiatric patients in addition to their primary care patients. 8 This creates an extremely volatile situation. Psychiatric 9 10 patients have special needs that are more adequately addressed by professionals who specialize in psychiatry. According to the 11 University of Hawaii department of family medicine and community 12 13 health, twenty-five to twenty-eight per cent of psychiatric 14 patients who have received psychiatric care from primary care physicians stopped therapy within one month, and more than forty 15 16 per cent stopped therapy within three months. Primary care 17 physicians often under-dose psychiatric patients and have 18 difficulty with patients' adherence to therapy.

1 By encouraging a collaborative effort between primary care 2 physicians and psychiatrists, the State can help psychiatric patients receive more effective treatment, and primary care 3 4 physicians can receive guidance in proper dosing of psychotropic 5 medications and therapy adherence. In addition to periodic 6 face-to-face consultations with primary care physicians, 7 psychiatrists could effectively reach more patients by 8 consulting with primary care physicians via teleconferences and 9 group lectures on psychiatric disorders and treatment such as 10 anxiety disorders and treatment for depression. 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish a psychiatric 12 health services pilot project to introduce an integrated 13 behavioral model at the Bay Clinic, West Hawaii Community Health 14 Center, and other federally qualified community health centers on the island of Hawaii to enable: 15 16 Psychiatrists to collaborate with primary care (1)

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physicians; and

20 SECTION 2. Psychiatric health services; pilot project;
21 expansion. There is established within the department of health

pilot project to enable psychiatrists to collaborate with 1 2 primary care physicians and a mental health team at the Bay 3 Clinic, West Hawaii Community Health Center, and any other 4 federally qualified health centers on the island of Hawaii to 5 provide patients with psychiatric health care. The pilot program shall provide two psychiatrists and a licensed clinical 6 7 social worker to work with existing mental health providers at 8 participating health centers to treat any patient in need of 9 psychiatric services.

10 The department of health shall submit an annual report to 11 the legislature on the pilot program no later than January 15, 12 2009, 2010, 2011, and 2012. The initial report shall include 13 funding proposals for the pilot program for the 2009-2011 fiscal 14 biennium as well as any proposed legislation.

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000 or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the 18 psychiatric health services pilot project pursuant to this Act. 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 20 health for the purposes of this Act.
