A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is critical for 2 the safety, health, and well-being of residents of rural areas 3 in the state, particularly those areas where access is 4 restricted to single-lane roads served by numerous bridges, that 5 transportation be maintained, especially in anticipation of 6 catastrophic events such as earthquakes and flooding. Hawaii 7 experienced two sizeable seismic events on October 15, 2006, 8 that caused electrical blackouts and disruption to 9 transportation in various areas of the State. On the island of 10 Maui, especially on the road between Hana and Kipahulu on the 11 southeastern side of the island, several bridges on the one-lane 12 road were damaged when the earthquakes fractured rock 13 foundations beneath the bridges. Paihi bridge on the Hana 14 highway had to be closed and replaced with a temporary bridge. 15 Military helicopters had to make deliveries of food, water, and 16 fuel to residents affected by the shutdown of the bridge. During the summer of 2007, a landslide and heavy rains caused 17 18 flooding that closed that temporary bridge for two months. HB2577 HD1 HMS 2008-1517

The legislature finds that, according to a 2006 federal 1 2 Department of Transportation assessment, 46 per cent of Hawaii's 3 bridges (513 of 1,110) are classified substandard, of which 156 4 are classified structurally deficient and 357 are classified 5 functionally obsolete, ranking the State as the third worst in 6 the nation. Although a substandard classification does not 7 necessarily mean those bridges are unsafe, certain bridges will 8 never be brought up to current federal standards. For example, 9 there is no practicable way to provide two-lane access to the 10 more than 50 bridges along the one-lane Hana highway. However, as experience with the earthquakes of 2006 and the landslide and 11 12 heavy rains during the summer of 2007 has shown, the Maui County 13 civil defense agency needs to take precautionary measures in 14 terms of anticipatory disaster contingency planning to maintain 15 continued access to the numerous communities served by the Hana 16 highway and its many one-lane bridges in the event of a 17 catastrophic event.

18 The purpose of this Act is to require Maui County Civil
19 Defense to prepare a disaster contingency plan to maintain
20 access to communities served by the Hana highway, including its
21 numerous one-lane bridges.

1 (c) The administrator shall submit the disaster 2 contingency plan, including findings, recommendations, and any necessary proposed legislation to the legislature no later than 3 4 20 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2009. 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 6 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to the 7 8 county of Maui for the Maui civil defense agency to prepare the 9 disaster contingency plan pursuant to section 2. 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of 11 Maui for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,except that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
