H.B. NO.2599

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A NEW STADIUM AT KAPOLEI.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Aloha Stadium, 2 which first opened on September 12, 1975, has served as the 3 venue for numerous sporting, music, and other events but that 4 its useful life is drawing to an end. Remediation of the 5 corrosion of Aloha Stadium's structural steel from 1985 to 1995 6 has already cost \$80,000,000 and yet the structural 7 certification performed in 1995 did not examine wind loads on 8 the structure so that the structural safety of Aloha Stadium under wind loading is still unknown. A plethora of other issues 9 still need to be addressed concerning structural safety and 10 11 general conditions. A 2005 study identified a host of capital 12 improvements to Aloha Stadium that, if fully implemented 13 together with a systematic, cyclic capital improvement program 14 throughout its remaining life, would extend the useful life of 15 the stadium twenty to thirty years. However, the anticipated 16 cost for the initial improvements needed would total \$99,200,000 17 with an additional \$115,400,000 anticipated to be expended for 18 ongoing maintenance over a twenty-year period.



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1 The purpose of this Act is to explore an alternative approach to maintaining an aging and costly Aloha Stadium. 2 3 SECTION 2. Department of accounting and general services; 4 stadium preliminary and final reports. (a) The department of 5 accounting and general services shall immediately: 6 Undertake plans for the demolition of Aloha Stadium (1)7 and salvaging of scrap and debris; 8 (2)Enter into discussions with the city and county of 9 Honolulu and, with the assistance of Hawaii's congressional delegation, responsible agencies of the 10 11 United States government concerning the removal of the 12 condition in the quitclaim deed of the Aloha Stadium 13 site to the city and county of Honolulu and the State 14 that requires that the land be used for public recreational purposes, including the operation of a 15 16 stadium; 17 (3) Engage in the conceptual planning and engineering for 18 a predominantly low- and moderate-income housing 19 development, along with appropriate mixed-uses and the 20 inclusion of a mass transit station, at the Aloha

21 Stadium site;



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1	(4)	Prepare a preliminary project package for a request	
2		for proposals to solicit proposals for the private	
3		development of the housing and mixed-use development,	
4		including the demolition of Aloha Stadium and	
5		salvaging of scrap and debris;	
6	(5)	Identify available public lands in Kapolei on Oahu for	
7		the development of a new stadium with a minimum	
8		seating capacity of , to be developed	
9		publicly, in joint venture with a private developer,	
10		or on a turn-key or lease-back basis; and	
11	(6)	Study whether a new stadium should continue to be	
12		under the stadium authority or transferred to the	
13		University of Hawaii or another existing or new state	
14		agency.	
15	(b)	The department of accounting and general services	
16	shall submit a preliminary report to the legislature not later		
17	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session		
18	of 2009 on the progress of its planning activities, which shall		
19	include the following:		

20 (1) A preliminary timetable for:

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21 (A) The demolition of Aloha Stadium and salvaging of
22 scrap and debris;



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1		(B) The request for proposals process;
2		(C) The housing and mixed-use development at the
3		Aloha Stadium site; and
4		(D) The development of the new stadium; and
5	(2)	A conceptual site and development plan for the
6		development of the new stadium in Kapolei on Oahu;
7	(3)	A conceptual site and development plan for the housing
8		and mixed-use development at the Aloha Stadium site;
9	(4)	The preliminary estimated costs for:
10		(A) The demolition of Aloha Stadium and salvaging of
11		scrap and debris;
12		(B) The housing and mixed-use development at the
13		Aloha Stadium site; and
14		(C) The development of the new stadium in Kapolei,
15		including the costs of all necessary
16		infrastructure to serve the new facility;
17	(5)	A preliminary real estate appraisal of a vacant Aloha
18		Stadium site; and
19	(6)	A report on the status of the discussions with the
20		city and county of Honolulu and the responsible
21		agencies of the United States government on the
22		removal of the condition in the deed to the city and
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1 county of Honolulu and the State that the Aloha 2 Stadium site must be used for public recreational 3 purposes. 4 The department of accounting and general services (C) 5 shall submit a final report to the legislature not later than 6 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 7 2010, which shall include the following: 8 (1)A final timetable, updating the preliminary timetable 9 submitted in the 2009 preliminary report; 10 (2)The conceptual plan for the development of the new 11 stadium in Kapolei on Oahu, including a proposal for 12 the public development of the stadium or, if the 13 stadium is to be privately developed, a complete 14 request for proposals package for the development of the stadium, including architect renderings, 15 16 engineering report, and specifications and guidelines 17 for the development; A request for proposals package for the development of 18 (3) 19 the former Aloha Stadium site, including the 20 conceptual plan, architect renderings, engineering 21 report, and specifications and guidelines for the 22 development;



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1	(4)	The final estimated costs for the demolition of Aloha
2		Stadium, redevelopment at the Aloha Stadium site, and
3		the development of the new stadium, updating the
4		preliminary cost estimates submitted in the
5		preliminary report;
6	(5)	The final real estate appraisal of the vacant Aloha
7		Stadium site;
8	(6)	A final determination on the removal of the condition
9		in the deed to the city and county of Honolulu and the
10		State that the Aloha Stadium site must be used for
11		public recreational purposes; and
12	(7)	A recommendation on the state agency that should
13		manage, operate, and maintain the new stadium.
14	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Requires department of accounting and general services, prior to the convening of the 2009 and 2010 regular sessions, to submit preliminary and final plans to the legislature to demolish Aloha Stadium and build low- and moderate-income housing on the site and identify a new location and build a new stadium in Kapolei.
