# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 11-196.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a)	The organizational report shall include:
4	(1)	The full name of the committee, which may not include
5		the name of a candidate;
6	(2)	The complete mailing address and telephone number of
7		the committee;
8	(3)	The date the committee was organized;
9	(4)	The area, scope, or jurisdiction of the committee;
10	(5)	An indication as to whether the committee is a
11		political party committee;
12	(6)	The name and mailing address of a corporation or an
13		organization that provides funds to the committee. If
14		the committee is not sponsored by or connected with a
15		corporation or an organization, the committee [must]
16		shall specify the trade, profession, or primary
17		interest of contributors to the committee;



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1	(7)	The full name, mailing address, telephone number,
2		occupation, and principal place of business of the
3		chairperson;
4	(8)	The full name, mailing address, telephone number,
5		occupation, and principal place of business of the
6		treasurer and any other officers;
7	(9)	An indication of whether the committee was formed to
8		support or oppose a specific ballot question or
9		questions, or candidate and if so, a brief description
10		of the questions or the name of the candidate;
11	(10)	The full name, mailing address, telephone number,
12		occupation, and principal place of business of the
13		custodian of the books and accounts if other than the
14		designated officers;
15	(11)	The full name and address of the depository in which
16		the committee will maintain its campaign account;
17	(12)	Written acceptance of appointment by the chairperson
18		and treasurer;
19	(13)	A certification of the statement by the chairperson
20		and the treasurer; and
21	(14)	The name, address, occupation, and employer of each
22		donor who has contributed an aggregate amount of more



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1		than [ $\$100$ ] $\$250$ since the last election and the	
2		amount and date of deposit of each such contribution."	
3	SECT	ION 2. Section 11-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:	
5	"(c)	Surplus funds may be used after a general or special	
6	election for:		
7	(1)	Any fundraising activity;	
8	(2)	Any other politically related activity sponsored by	
9		the candidate;	
10	(3)	Any ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in	
11		connection with the candidate's duties as a holder of	
12		an elected state or county office; or	
13	(4)	Any contribution to any community service,	
14		educational, youth, recreational, charitable,	
15		scientific, or literary organization; provided that in	
16		any election cycle, the total amount of all	
17		contributions from campaign funds and surplus funds	
18		shall be no more than <u>twice</u> the maximum amount that	
19		one person or other entity may contribute to that	
20		candidate pursuant to section 11-204(a); provided	
21		further that no contributions from campaign funds	
22		shall be made from the date the candidate files	
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1	nomination papers to the date of the general
2	election."
3	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

### Report Title:

Campaign Spending

#### Description:

Increases the threshold amount that must be reported in noncandidate committee organizational reports. Doubles the amount a candidate can transfer from campaign or surplus funds to a community or charitable organization. (HB2602 HD1)
