Sole proprietors subject to this section shall comply with applicable campaign contribution limits in section 11-204. 12 13 [<del>(c)</del>] (d) For purposes of this section, "completion of the 14 contract" means that the parties to the government contract have 15 either terminated the contract prior to completion of performance or fully performed the duties and obligations under 16 17 the contract, no disputes relating to the performance and 18 payment remain under the contract, and all disputed claims have 19 been adjudicated and are final." 20 SECTION 2.
