A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARIJUANA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§329- Medical marijuana; secure growing facility.
5	(a) The department of health shall develop and implement a
6	secure growing facility on the island of Maui for medical
7	marijuana to provide a secure space for the growth of medical
8	marijuana by a certified facilitator to be made available to
9	qualifying patients or primary caregivers. The facility shall
10	grow not more than ninety-eight marijuana plants at any time.
11	(b) Qualifying patients shall be eligible to lease a plot
12	from the State within the secure growing facility for the
13	cultivation of sufficient numbers of marijuana plants by a
14	certified facilitator to provide a steady supply of medical
15	marijuana for the patient.
16	(c) The department of health shall employ a certified
17	facilitator to assist patients who have leased a plot in the
18	facility in determining the strains of medical marijuana needed



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- 1 and designing a growing system to establish a stock of healthy
- 2 plants to ensure the production of an adequate supply of usable
- 3 medical marijuana to meet the patient's medical needs; provided
- 4 that the prospective certified facilitators shall be required to
- 5 create and submit a five year organic farm plan based on no
- 6 fewer than two organic crops to qualify to use the secured space
- 7 for the purposes of this section.
- 8 (d) The department of health shall be authorized to enter
- 9 into a contract with a certified facilitator pursuant to chapter
- **10** 103D.
- 11 (e) The department of health shall establish procedures
- 12 and develop rules to allow qualified patients or their primary
- 13 caregivers to access the supply of medical marijuana that is
- 14 being grown for them to ensure receipt of an adequate amount of
- 15 medical marijuana to meet their medical needs."
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 329-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by:
- 18 1. Adding definitions for "certified contractor", "plot",
- 19 and "secure growing facility" or "facility":
- ""Certified facilitator" means an organization
- 21 knowledgeable in the propagation, growth, harvesting, and



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- 1 preparation for medicinal use of the various strains of
- 2 marijuana that may be used by a qualified patient.
- 3 "Plot" means a section of planting ground in a secure
- 4 growing facility that is large enough to grow not more than
- 5 seven mature marijuana plants and is allocated for the growth of
- 6 medical marijuana for a qualified patient.
- 7 "Secure growing facility" or "facility" means a primary
- 8 agricultural growing space available to qualified patients to
- 9 grow medical marijuana that is secured by electric-eye
- 10 technology, security cameras with a satellite uplink to enable
- 11 relaying and recording of images in a local police station,
- 12 motion detectors, security dogs, and two fences for a total
- 13 fenced area not less than seventy-five feet by one-hundred-fifty
- **14** feet."
- 15 2. Amending the definition of "qualifying patient" to
- 16 read as follows:
- ""Qualifying patient" or "patient" means a person who has
- 18 been diagnosed by a physician as having a debilitating medical
- 19 condition."
- 20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the



- 1 establishment of a secure growing facility for the production of
- 2 medical marijuana.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Description:

Authorizes the establishment of a secure growing facility for the production of medical marijuana for not more than fourteen qualified patients.
