A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE PROCEEDINGS ON THE INTERNET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. 1 The legislature finds that it is crucial to the 2 decision-making of the legislature to have citizen involvement and input into the legislative process and that one of the most 3 effective means of promoting this is through public access. 4 The 5 legislature has demonstrated its commitment to the principle of 6 public access to the legislative process by creating programs 7 such as:

- 8 (1) The public access room;
- 9 (2) The legislative broadcast program; and
- 10 (3) The legislative website,

11 that encourage education and support for citizen involvement in 12 the legislative process.

Televised coverage of legislative sessions and hearings is an important source of information for citizen participation in public proceedings. At present, some legislative sessions are available through the legislative broadcast project, but those are limited to cable television viewers and are available only

at certain broadcast times. Another method of reaching a
broader audience is broadcasting legislative events through
video and audio on the Internet.

4 This process, called streaming media, or webcasting, takes 5 video or audio signals of an event and converts them into a 6 digital file. The file is routed through computer servers for 7 broadcast on the Internet. With a webcasting player, software that is available for free, users can see or listen to the file 8 9 on their computers. This technology allows messages to be 10 broadcast on all islands and beyond, and recordings of live 11 webcasts can be archived so that users can listen to or view a 12 file whenever they wish. These streaming media, or webcasting 13 programs can also be accessed wherever computers are available, 14 such as public libraries, schools, youth centers, and other 15 public places. This technology would increase public access at 16 a low cost to the State.

In addition, the indexed video and audio streams of legislative sessions and hearings will assist citizens on Oahu who wish to testify before the legislature but whose time is limited. Instead of spending an entire morning at the legislature waiting for their bill to be heard, citizens can

follow the progress of the hearing on the Internet while at home
or work and can decide when to go and testify.

The purpose of this Act is to further enhance public access by funding archived and indexed video and audio streams of legislative proceedings to be broadcast in streaming media format on the Internet, including broadcasts from the house and senate chambers, house and senate conference rooms, and the capitol auditorium.

9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the following sums or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for two 12 archived and indexed video streams and two archived and indexed 13 audio streams of legislative proceedings on the Internet, 14 including broadcasts from the house and senate chambers, house 15 and senate conference rooms, and the capitol auditorium:

Description: Appropriates funds for archived and indexed video and audio streams of legislative proceedings on the internet.
