## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 5 read:
- 6 "(d) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 7 the regular sessions of 2007 and 2008, the task force shall
- 8 provide to the legislature a report on its activities [→];
- 9 provided that not less than twenty days prior to the convening
- 10 of the regular session of 2010, the task force shall provide the
- 11 legislature a final report of its activities.
- 12 (e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30,
- **13** [2008.] 2010."
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for travel
- 17 and clerical expenses of the Hawaii anti-trafficking task force.
- 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 19 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
